The Drugans left County Tyrone, Ireland in 1849 and emigrated via New York. They likely lived for a short time in Sullivan, Pennsylvania with James Drugan and family, and then moved to Kane, Illinois. They then moved to the village of Norway in Caledonia Township, Racine County, Wisconsin in 1854, and then to the village of Trempealeau in Trempealeau County, Wisconsin around 1855. They first lived on the lands near what is now the Old Catholic Cemetery in Trempealeau.

As published in "Commemorative Biographical Record of Racine and Kenosha Counties" (Chicago: 1906), pages 498-499

The first settler in the town of Norway (Racine County, Wisconsin) was Thomas Drought, who came from Lower Canada, with oxen and wagon, and in September, 1838, made a claim of 160 acres in Section No. 12, in the northeast part of the town, where he has ever since resided. He was accompanied in his settlement by a sister, and was afterward followed by other members of the family, and the section of the town where he located has ever since been known as the "Drought"

Settlement." James Ash came into Norway in the autumn of '38, and Alfred Thompson and George Drought in '39.

In the summer of 1839, a vessel arrived at Milwaukee laden with a party of sturdy emigrants, about forty in number, fresh from their homes among the Norway mountains. They were destined for Illinois, but were prevailed upon to delay their journey. Mr. George Walker, whom good health had made ruddy and corpulent, urging them to settle in Wisconsin, and another person, from Illinois, whose countenance fever and ague had sadly blighted, urging them to carry out their original intention. The healthfulness of climate, as then judged of by the appearance of the representatives of the two states, decided the question with the rugged Norwegian pioneers, and they chose Wisconsin as their future home. -- They had listened with wonder to descriptions of the great land beyond the ocean, the strong attachments that bind dwellers among beautiful mountain scenes to their native huts and lost their power of restraint, and now with brave hearts and determined purpose, they were ready for hardship, adventure and work. A few days after landing at Milwaukee they lost their faithful interpreter, who was accidentally drowned in the river, but furnished with guides, a party of emigrants set out upon explorations, and soon found themselves within the vicinity of Muskego Lake. It was a dry season, and the marshes resembled prairies in their appearance surrounded by forests. Cabins soon sprung up on the hillsides around the marshes, but the bright hopes of the settlers were quenched when the spring floods came and converted the promising prairie land into lake and morasses. This caused a removal of the colony further south and west. Mr. Halver Thompson settled on the banks of Wind Lake; John Nelson, another of the party, settled on an adjoining claim, which he improved considerably, and from which he subsequently removed to Kos Kenong prairie. An American by the name of Flether also located in the vicinity of these settlements.

In the spring of 1840 Soren Backe and Johannes Johansen, men of intelligence and means, who had come from Norway the preceding fall, and spent the winter in Illinois, visited the region. They were looking for a place to establish a colony. The cluster of beautiful lakes, the clear streams of living water swarming with fish, and the forests abounding with game, which they found in the town of Norway, satisfied their desires. A cabin was built on the bank of one of the lakes; reports of the country were sent to their friends across the sea, and in the fall of 1840 Evan Hansen, known also as Evan Hansen Heg, arrived with a large company of emigrants and settled around the lakes. Backe having considerable capital, which he invested in a large tract of land, sold parcels to the poorer colonists upon favorable terms. In a short time the colony increased in numbers and became the center of Scandinavian emigration to the state, and Johannes Johansen, Soren Backe and Evan Hansen were regarded the founders of the first permanent Scandinavian colony in Wisconsin. Among the other colonists were Sivert Ingerbretsen, Knud Arslarksen, Johannes Evensen, Ole Hogensen, Gurder Gurtesen, Niels H. Narum, John Larsen, Hans Jacobsen, Peter Jacobsen and Ole Andersen.

A trading point was established on Mr. Heg's farm. An excavation was made in a large Indian mound and roofed over and fitted up into commodious apartments for families. Johannes Johansen received the appellation of "King" and here the colonists received their supplies and mail, and the first Scandinavian newspaper in the country was published, called the Nord Lyset (Northern Light), and edited by J. D. Raymert. This was also the birthplace of John P. Jacobsen, to whom I am indebted for information concerning the establishment of the first Scandinavian settlement in Norway.

Evan Hansen was the father of Hans C. and Ole Heg. His name, as inscribed on his gravestone, is Evan Hansen Heg, and I am told that the name Heg was derived from the place where the family lived in Norway, of the farm which they possessed, and which was known as "Headquarters."

A log church was built at the central point of the settlement, by the colonists, in 1845. The settlers were a religious people, and of the Lutheran belief. In the church yard, where the log church was built, many of the original founders of the colony were buried, and here rest the remains of Hans C. Heg, a gallant soldier, who fell fighting the battles of his adopted country.

The town of Norway was created by an act of the Territorial legislature on the 11th of February, 1847, and the people who gave to the town its name, and who have so successfully built up the colony originally projected by those I have named, have distinguished themselves as among the most prudent, industrious, and thrifty citizens of the county.

Patrick Lowery and Patrick Drugan, the latter a brother of Thomas Drugan, came to Trempealeau in 1855. ...Patrick Drugan settled in the town of Trempealeau on the place now owned by Patrick Lowery. The Drugan's came from the county of Tyrone in the North of Ireland and lived some five years in Illinois before coming to Trempealeau."

History indicates that an Irishman made the first permanent settlement in this, even before the county was formed. It is said that one Thomas Drugan, straight from the "owld sod," took up residence in what is now the village of Trempealeau in 1853, when straggling hunters and trappers made up the scant population. At that time, the area was a part of La Crosse, for that was before Judge George Gale succeeded in forming the present Trempealeau County from parts of La Crosse and Buffalo counties.

Typical Irish, coming from County Tyrone in North Ireland, were the Drugan's, for Thomas was joined by his brother Patrick, and by Patrick Lowery. To this day, the name Drugan is familiar in Trempealeau village. 1855 saw the arrival of Frank Feeney, Dan Galligan, and James Brady. The Sullivan's and the McCarthys within a few years were added to the growing population of Trempealeau.

Among the early Irish in Trempealeau was one Barney McGraw, credited with the quick wit and ready humor of his country. He lived in a small cottage probably of the kind which inspired the song "Tumble-Down Shack in Athlone" and other Irish songs. One of the jokes relished by his friends, and to this day vouched for by one who heard it, is quoted from Barney McGraw. He was one of several men repairing an old house, and was at work in the basement. Needing assistance, he called to the men above, "How many of yez are up there?" "Three," came the answer. "Then the half o' yez come down here," Barney called. It was said that McGraw often voiced his regret that, though he was of pure Irish stock, he had been born in the state of New York instead of in Ireland.

Throughout Trempealeau, the Irish were sprinkled "like leavening in a pan of dough." Scarcely a nook or a corner of the county but had it's Irish settlers, descendants of whom have been a bulwark to on-coming generations.

The Drugan's left County Tyrone, Ireland and arrived at the port of New York, NY in May 1848 (per Patrick Drugan, Sr. naturalization documents) Whether they emigrated as a family or individually is not known. Patrick Drugan, Jr. naturalization papers indicate he arrived in New York from Ireland in 1849.

Upon arrival, they may have lived for a short time with the James Drugan family in Sullivan County, Pennsylvania.

They settled in Kane County, Illinois near the town of Elgin, remaining there until around 1854 when they moved to Caledonia Township, Trempealeau County, Wisconsin.

Of the 5 sons born to Patrick Drugan, Sr., all except one were born in Ireland. Only the son Charles Drugan was an American-born son of Patrick, born in Illinois in 1852. He was not the first American-born Drugan. That distinction goes to Thomas, son of Francis Drugan and Mary Malanaphy, born in 1848 in Illinois.

Their original homestead was near the Old Catholic Cemetery in Trempealeau.

All of the Drugans arriving in the US were eventually naturalized. There is some debate as to whether or not Peter Drugan was born in Ireland or in Kane County, IL. Census records indicate Ireland, while his death record indicates Elgin, Kane County, Illinois. Furthermore, no naturalization records have yet been found for Peter Drugan, while other members in his family are listed as follows:

This census entry from 1850 is probably the wrong family but the similarities are striking. The Drugans were supposed to be living in Racine County, Wisconsin around that time, and Patrick wife's name was Anne. Some of the children's names aren't the same but some of the ages come very close.

Patrick and Anne's graves are unmarked with the location being "Near Town". The land for this cemetery is part of the farm that they owned, land donated by Patrick Lowery. That statement of "near town" is confusing considering that the cemetery was probably established in 1880 and Patrick did not die until 1882. It is not known for certain if Patrick and Anne are actually buried within the Old Catholic Cemetery and there are no markers to indicate that they were. Patrick owned 120 acres of land in Section 24 which is just on the NW side of the existing Old Catholic Cemetery. He sold all or part of his farm to Patrick Lowery who in 1880 donated some of land to the Catholic diocese for use as a cemetery. They may have been buried on a part of their farm that was not donated to the Catholic diocese. If so, those grave sites on the farm may have long since been obliterated by the current owner of the farmland. The only clue to the location of their graves comes from the description of "close to town".

There have been many discussions concerning the cemetery land and the Drugan farm land. Researcher Robert Westphal, Jr. remarks, "Wow. I recall uncle Eli (Motschenbacher) telling me that the cemetery was surrounded by land that used to belong to the Drugans. I was never quite clear about which cemetery he was always talking about, since we'd hit all of them each summer. I guess that means that the Drugan's sold out to Patrick Lowery at some point. Another mystery is that uncle Eli said that the Drugan's (don't know which one) owned a small house and some land out on the road going to Perrot Park, near where Carl Keefe lived. I've never been able to substantiate this... got any info?

Apparently the answer to the two statements about the Drugan land are this. The Patrick Drugan land was 120 acres in Section 24 while the cemetery is on Patrick Lowery land just to the southwest in Section 23. Therefore the cemetery was never "surrounded by land that used to belong to the Drugans." The second statement about Drugan land on the road going to Perrot Park most likely was for another Drugan probably after Patrick Drugan had died. Researcher Dale Ebersold replied on 7 Feb 2013, Eli Motschenbacher (my dad's coon hunting buddy) told you right about land belonging to the Drugans on the way out to Perrot Park. It's the west prairie road, not the river road just before leaving the Trempealeau village limits. It's now called Pine Street till 10th Street, then becomes Park Road. I believe the house is still standing. As you leave Trempealeau on Pine Street, take a left on 10th. There's a new home on the corner facing 10th Street but the next one is a small white home also facing 10th Street. I had that Drugan house as part of my paper route in the late 40's before I began high school. I think it belonged to the "old" Hubie (Hubert) Drugan. I believe the old Shrake house was where the new corner house is standing.

The actual land transfers for the Old Catholic Cemetery went like this. Patrick Lowery, on 17 Apr 1880, for "a dollar in hand," had "given granted bargained sold" three acres of his farm to the La Crosse Diocese. Then on 9 Aug 2007, the La Crosse Catholic Diocese did a "quit claim deed" assigning the land to the local St. Bartholomew parish in Trempealeau.



History indicates that an Irishman made the first permanent settlement in this, even before the county was formed. It is said that one Thomas Drugan, straight from the "owld sod," took up residence in what is now the village of Trempealeau in 1853, when straggling hunters and trappers made up the scant population. At that time, the area was a part of La Crosse, for that was before Judge George Gale succeeded in forming the present Trempealeau County from parts of La Crosse and Buffalo counties.

Typical Irish, coming from County Tyrone in North Ireland, were the Drugan's, for Thomas was joined by his brother Patrick, and by Patrick Lowery. To this day, the name Drugan is familiar in Trempealeau village. 1855 saw the arrival of Frank Feeney, Dan Galligan, and James Brady. The Sullivan's and the McCarthys within a few years were added to the growing population of Trempealeau.

Among the early Irish in Trempealeau was one Barney McGraw, credited with the quick wit and ready humor of his country. He lived in a small cottage probably of the kind which inspired the song "Tumble-Down Shack in Athlone" and other Irish songs. One of the jokes relished by his friends, and to this day vouched for by one who heard it, is quoted from Barney McGraw. He was one of several men repairing an old house, and was at work in the basement. Needing assistance, he called to the men above, "How many of yez are up there?" "Three," came the answer. "Then the half o' yez come down here," Barney called. It was said that McGraw often voiced his regret that, though he was of pure Irish stock, he had been born in the state of New York instead of in Ireland.

Throughout Trempealeau, the Irish were sprinkled "like leavening in a pan of dough." Scarcely a nook or a corner of the county but had it's Irish settlers, descendants of whom have been a bulwark to on-coming generations.

Hi Rob,

I found just a little for you. The obit is really a Thank you from the family, not an obit. It is very blurred, and almost unreadable. It is signed by Mrs. F. Drugan, Miss H. Drugan and Mr. and Mrs (C. W. Kelly) I believe and another Mr. and Mrs., that I can't read at all. It seems to be a camera error, as the other pages are readable, it just must have wiggled the page a bit as this page was microfilmed.

I checked marriage records for the years 1856-1900 but did not find either of the girls marriages recorded, nor did I find Francis or Mary's death recorded. Do you have any idea where they lived? If their farm was just across the county line,

they could have gone to church here, but deaths recorded in Dodge or Rice County. This seems to be at odds with the information from the census, I know, maybe they moved. I can check Rice County as I do research in that courthouse also.

CEDARVILLE, MN

Cedarville is one of the "deserted villages" of Martin county, Minn. Once a thriving trade center it has become a mere memory, all of its buildings having disappeared. There is nothing on its site today to suggest a village. The post office was discontinued in 1903. The name of the village is from Cedar lake. It was located at the extreme north shore of that body of water, in Sec. 24, Cedar township.

The post office was established in 1868 with Francis Drugan as postmaster. Phineas M. Dennis, one time postmaster, kept a store and took a great interest in public affairs and until his departure in 1877 was Cedarvilles' best boomer. He was at one time county commissioner and ran for the legislature the year before he left. Failing of election he decided to move. For thirty years Cedarville was on the map. It had two stores, hotel, blacksmith shop, wind grist mill and other enterprises. It was a place of great expectations, failing only because the railroads passed it by. The town was a strong contender for the "north route" of the Southern Minnesota when it built through Martin county in 1878. Had this route prevailed it is likely that Fairmont, and not Cedarville, would be the deserted village today.

When the Northwestern and St. Louis railroads built north and south across the county in 1899 Cedarville again had high hopes of becoming a railroad town. Failing, and the twin villages of Triumph and Monterey springing up nearby, decay was rapid after that time. Cedarville was regularly platted by R. T. Patrick in 1892. It comprised four blocks. The east and west thoroughfares were Patrick Street, Kennard Avenue and North Avenue. St. James Street ran north and south.

NOTE: Cedarville was a small village in Martin County, MN. Martin County is on the Iowa border in south central MN. County seat is Fairmont.

Francis Frank Drugan

Francis married **Mary Malanaphy**. Mary was born on 16 April 1824 in IRELAND, ^{76,77,79,80} died on 9 January 1910 in Kansas City, Jackson, Missouri, United States, ⁸⁰ at age 85, and was buried on 11 January 1910 in Sacred Heart Cemetery, Owatonna, Steele, Minnesota, United States. ⁸⁰ The cause of her death was Lobar Pneumonia.

Marriage Notes:

There is a 1855 Wisconsin State Census record for a Francis Drugan residing at Montoville, Trempealeau County, Wisconsin. Montoville was the previous name of Trempealeau.

However, this Wisconsin record did not list ages and the household population was listed as an aggregate number of males and females. Thus it is assumed that this 1855 record shows Francis Drugan was the head of the household with 1 male (himself) and 3 other females (most likely his wife and 2 daughters.)

However that record does not closely fit what is vaguely known about Francis Drugan and his wife, Mary Malanaphy. It is believed that he had 2 sons both born shortly before 1855 yet neither are listed as additional males in the household. These 2 sons did appear in the 1860 US Census with the family.

Francis and Mary probably had at least 3 daughters born before 1855, perhaps as many as 4, yet this 1855 record only provides for 2 additional females assuming that the wife was still present in the household.

There was one other Francis Drugan thought to be present in Trempealeau County around 1855 but there is practically nothing known about him or the possibility of any family.

General Notes:

There is something drastically wrong with the number of children listed as being born to Mary. In her 1900 US Census, she lists only a total of 4 children with only 2 being still alive yet there is a list of a total of 7 known children.

Here is about all I know for certain without becoming overwhelmingly confused:

Thomas and William are both shown on the 1860 US Census together so they are two different persons. Helen, Loretta, and Agnes are all shown on the 1870 US Census together so they are all three different persons.

That alone amounts to 5 children: two sons and three daughters. So therefore, I can safely assume that the "4 children total" information from the 1900 US Census is incorrect. The only unknown factor is that both the 1860 and 1870 US Census lists did not provide relationships. It is remotely possible that one or more of there children could have been a niece or an nephew.

Now for the children's names that are confusing. Helen and Caroline might be the same person. Their birth years are very close and their names never appear together on the same census. Additionally, the 1875 Minnesota State Census provides an age for Theresa as 23 making her birth year about 1852. That means perhaps Theresa is the same person are either Helen or Caroline or both.

Based on the 1880, 1885, 1895, and 1900 US Census lists, I strongly suspect that Helen, Caroline, and Theresa are the same person. The 1885, 1895, and 1900 show the mother always living with just one daughter by the name of Helen. The daughter Helen is not listed with the family in the 1880 US Census, but the name Theresa does appear. But in the 1870 US Census, the daughter "Theresa H." was listed and I suspect that Theresa's middle name was Helen. Thus we have Theresa Helen Drugan, the same as "Helen Drugan" and maybe somehow the same as "Caroline Drugan".

said that one Thomas Drugan, straight from the "owld sod," took up residence in what is now the village of Trempealeau in 1853, when straggling hunters and trappers made up the scant population. At that time, the area was a part of La Crosse, for that was before Judge George Gale succeeded in forming the present Trempealeau County from parts of La Crosse and Buffalo counties.

Typical Irish, coming from County Tyrone in North Ireland, were the Drugan's, for Thomas was joined by his brother Patrick, and by Patrick Lowery. To this day, the name Drugan is familiar in Trempealeau village. 1855 saw the arrival of Frank Feeney, Dan Galligan, and James Brady. The Sullivan's and the McCarthys within a few years were added to the growing population of Trempealeau.

Among the early Irish in Trempealeau was one Barney McGraw, credited with the quick wit and ready humor of his country. He lived in a small cottage probably of the kind which inspired the song "Tumble-Down Shack in Athlone" and other Irish songs. One of the jokes relished by his friends, and to this day vouched for by one who heard it, is quoted from Barney McGraw. He was one of several men repairing an old house, and was at work in the basement. Needing assistance, he called to the men above, "How many of yez are up there?" "Three," came the answer. "Then the half o' yez come down here," Barney called. It was said that McGraw often voiced his regret that, though he was of pure Irish stock, he had been born in the state of New York instead of in Ireland.

Throughout Trempealeau, the Irish were sprinkled "like leavening in a pan of dough." Scarcely a nook or a corner of the county but had it's Irish settlers, descendants of whom have been a bulwark to on-coming generations.

NOTE - I have yet to confirm if Thomas Drugan was killed in the Civil War but given the fact that his son Constantine was born in Arkansas and the 6th Missouri Cavalry saw extensive action in Arkansas, there might be a correlation between those two facts. It could be possible that he participated in the Battle of Prairie Grove, Arkansas in which there were over 2,500 casualties. The CSA units included the 2nd Brigade: Colonel Joseph O. Shelby (Shelby's Raiders) (commanding 1475 men on the battlefield). It consisted of the following units:

4th Missouri Cavalry - Colonel Beal G. Jeans (334 men)

5th Missouri Cavalry - Colonel Benjamin F. Gordon (338 men)

6th Missouri Cavalry - Colonel Gideon W. Thompson (333 men)

Elliot's Missouri Cavalry battalion - Captain Benjamin Elliott (101 men)

Quantrill's Company - Lt. William Gregg (33 men)

Bledsoe's Missouri Battery - Captain Joseph Bledsoe (36 men, two six pound smooth bore cannon)

There is no information about what happened to Thomas and Elizabeth following his enlistment for military duty in the CSA. By 1865 Elizabeth was living in Arkansas where she gave birth to Constantine and it is not known if Thomas was alive at the time. By 1870, even Elizabeth disappeared from the scene and Constantine was living with his grandmother, Jane Burch-Storm back in Missouri according to the 1870 census records. In 1880 it appears that their son Constantine had moved to Indiana and at the age of 17 was living with and working as a "chore boy" for another family in Greene County, Indiana. This suggests that perhaps both of his parents were killed in the Civil War. One of the reasons that he moved back to Greene County, Indiana is that his mother and all her siblings were born there.

In October 2014, Beth Tuck Beth Tuck <tuckea1@gmail.com> provided the following information about Thomas Drugan and Elizabeth Storm:

Three of Peter Lunsford Storm's sons (James B., Isaac, & Peter L. Jr.) and his Thomas DRUGAN enlisted to fight for the Confederacy. Remarkably all four lived to the end of the war. Peter would have been nearly 60 at the start of the war, but his age did not keep him out of the conflict. According to "1883 History of Jasper County, Missouri", Peter L. STORM was "killed by Federals at his house near Galesburg" and his son William was also "killed by the Federals" near the Center Creek Mines in 1864. Though no date was given for Peter's murder it can be assumed to have taken place between 1861 and 1864. Peter is assumed to have been buried on his own property near Galesburg. No tombstone has been recorded.

What I pieced together was that Thomas Drugan, Isaac Storm and James Storm enlisted in the summer of 1862. They seem to have enlisted in Arkansas. All of them are associated with Coffee's Regiment of Calvary at some point. Sometimes it's called Missouri Calvary, sometimes Arkansas Calvary. The name of the unit fluctuates throughout the war (Coffee was court marshaled a few times) and our men seem to move between units. You see the unit names Thomas Drugan is associated with below.

The Storms are also associated with the 27th Arkansas Infantry. Both units formed in northern Arkansas in the summer of 1862. At one point I saw Isaac and James on a list of deserters, but that could be the confusion of units breaking up and reforming as much as anything. I want to say that Fold3 had records of Confederate soldiers who were present to surrender in 1865. The cards didn't have much more than their names and the unit they were part of at the time of surrender. I'm positive I saw digital copies of the cards somewhere and having exhausted the other possibilities I'm pretty sure it's Fold3. I want to say the top of the cards were filled in with the names in longhand and that at the bottom of the card was printed in tiny print an agreement to cease hostilities. It was a loyalty oath in effect. I believe Thomas Drugan was one of the ones with a card, and that's why I concluded they all survived the war, but I guess my memory isn't good enough to swear to it now. I do remember Peter L. Storm Jr had a card, because he seems to have enlisted later than the others. John Storm may have also enlisted, but the name is too common for me to be sure he's the John Storm in my family.

I don't know who Elizabeth stayed with while her husband was at war, but her child, Constantine, was born in Arkansas around 1865. With Peter Storm Sr. getting shot in his own yard and William Storm shot not far from home, it's quite possible the entire family was forced off the property at various times. Of course I have no idea what happened to Thomas & Elizabeth after 1865 but I did look for them in all the places the rest of the family disbursed to.

So I guess you might want to get the free trial membership on Fold3 and see how accurate my memory is. You probably deal with this all the time but I always have to search every possible spelling of Drugan, Drogan, Druggun, etc. And when looking for Storm you also need to search Storms.

If I turn up anything else I will let you know, and if you should know what happened to Constantine I'd be really interested in hearing it.

On the 1880 US Census, Andrew indicated his age to be 47 which would suggest a birth year of about 1833.

On the 1900 US Census, Andrew provided a birth date of March 1834 and a current age of 66.

A FamilySearch.org online database entitled "Wisconsin Deaths and Burials, 1835-1968" provides a birth date of 10 Mar 1832.

From all of these records, there are only two sets of data which seem to repeat, namely a birth month of March and a birth year of about 1833. Normally a person's age on a census form should reflect his current age at the time of the enumeration. Because both the 1870 and 1880 census records reflect an enumeration date of the 1st of June, and given that Andrew was born in March, it would appear that the correct birth year should be 1833. If he were born in 1832, then his age on these two census records would have been 1 year greater than that which was shown.

And for the sake of convenience and compliance with most other researchers data, I choose to maintain the specific birth date as the 10th of March, which was the date from the database collection "Wisconsin Deaths and Burials, 1835-1968". Keep in mind that according to FamilySearch.org, this collection includes indexed church records, civil registrations, and the Internet indexing project sponsored by the LDS Church. This particular database does not differentiate from which source any piece of data may have come. In other words, the database, while sounding like a collection of official records, also includes data supplied by other researchers and may contain factual errors as well as transcription errors.







I have a copy of a very incomplete and ill-maintained ledger of burials from the local catholic church which is all they have concerning the old Catholic Cemetery. It shows a Patrick Drugan buried in Lot 51, Grave 1, which is at the top of the adjacent row where all the rest of the Drugans are buried. This ledger also lists an Elizabeth Drugan buried in grave 2 along side of Patrick which one would naturally assume would be his wife. Patrick and his wife were NOT the first Drugan's to be buried in this cemetery and one has to wonder exactly why he and his wife were not buried in the Drugan family plot in the next row. Was there some kind of family feud? Patrick and wife are in Lot 51 while the Drugan family plot is in the adjacent row and consists of Lots 65 and 66.

General Notes:

Patrick's true birth date seems only to come from parish records in Ireland. For every census in the US, he gave different birth years varying from 1840 to 1852. I believe that the most logical and correct birth date was 12 Oct 1845.

St. BRIDGET'S PARISH

The early Catholic settlers in the southeastern part of the county were few and widely scattered. Some lived in the town of Ettrick, some in the town of Gale and some in the town of Trempealeau. Being widely scattered, they never formed strong centers, such as we find in the towns of Arcadia, Dodge and Burnside. Having no parochial schools, prospective Catholic families who might otherwise have located there hesitated to do so. Hence the growth of the church in these three townships was not very rapid. Up to this day none of their parishes has sufficient means and a membership large enough to support a resident pastor without the assistance of some outside mission. None of them conduct a parochial school. For thirty-five years the priests residing at Ettrick had Galesville, Trempealeau and Roaring Creek as missions. Considering the distances from one church to another and the condition of the roads, one can easily imagine the hardships endured by the priests in administering to their scattered flock. More than one priest imperiled his life. At present the condition has been somewhat improved by the fact that Trempealeau has a resident pastor with

Galesville as a mission, and that the pastor of Saint Bridget's Parish is only obliged to attend to the mission at Roaring Creek. The early settlers in the sixties had no church, but mass was offered occasionally in the homes of some of the Catholics by pioneer priests from Saint Mary's Church, La Crosse, Wisconsin. Among these is especially remembered Rev. M. Marcoe. Saint Bridget's Parish was organized by Rev. C. A. Gerst in 1869 and the first church was erected at a cost of \$2,000 in 1870. On account of hardships connected with the work of Saint Bridget's and its remote missions the good spirits of the pastors were put to such a test, and their health so greatly impaired, that many had to request their bishop for a change after serving but a short time. Among these special mention must be given to Rev. White and Rev. Felix Bryne, who greatly improved and renovated the dilapidated condition into which, through age, the property had sunk. In 1904 Rev. M. Mark O'Connor built a church at Galesville, and, for a time, it was thought that the future of the church in this section of the county would be in Galesville. Hence three pastors who followed Rev. O'Connor established their residence at Galesville and Saint Bridget's became a mission. This, however, did not please the people of Ettrick. Greatly chagrined they took a determined stand against such a move. In time it did prove to the ecclesiastical authorities that the move to Galesville was impracticable, and in 1907 the residence of the pastor was reestablished at Ettrick. This served to reunite the people of Saint Bridget's and filled them with new hope and courage. Since then, under the administration of Rev. Briody, they erected a beautiful new church at a cost of \$9,000. This church was completed in Jun 1917. Unfortunately Rev. Briody did not see the full completion of the new church. On 5 Feb 1917, he was found dead in his home. On the previous day, which was bitter cold, he attended a sick call twenty miles in the country through large snowdrifts. This overtaxing of himself is supposed to have been directly responsible for his death. By boarding up the windows it was possible to conduct his funeral from the new church. His remains rest in the cemetery to the left of the church.

Saint Bridget's now counts 75 families or 220 souls. Now that they have an inviting church and are united the parish will see a period of great prosperity and healthy growth.

The present pastor, Rev. Henry Engelhardt, is a native of Germany. He was born on Oct. 5, 1886, and ordained on July 9, 1911. He belongs to the congregation of Oblate Missionaries and spent five years as missionary in India. At the outbreak of the war he was interned by the English, for no cause other than that he was a German in an English colony. Being confined for two years in a detention camp, he was released upon the condition that he would leave English soil. Coming to the United States, he was appointed pastor of Saint Bridget's Church. He is a man of great experiences, well versed in many languages, of energetic and courageous disposition, yet kind and winning in his ways. He has made

many friends in a short time and already done much for Saint Bridget's Parish.



His record of death from the Catholic church indicates that his birth place was Elgin, Illinois with a birth date in 1846. That would seem to be incorrect because the Drugan family did not emigrate from Ireland until 1849 and even then it appears that all of the Drugan families did not come over at one time but rather one-by-one over a course of several years. Peter's parents, Patrick Drugan and Anne Coyle, both indicated that they emigrated from Ireland in 1849 so it would seem impossible for Peter to have been born in Illinois in 1846.

However, Peter's actual birth date is believed to be 1849 which means that he could have been born in either Ireland or somewhere in the US. All of his census records all clearly state that he was born in Ireland. If Peter's birth date was in 1846 as the death record indicates, then his birth location was in Ireland because the parents didn't leave Ireland until 1848-1849. His younger brother, Charles, was born in 1852 in Illinois after the parents arrived in the US.

Researcher Robert Westphal reports that naturalization papers can be found for other members of his family but not for Peter himself which suggests that he was born in the US.

It would be so easy to solve this matter of his birth location by locating a passenger list when his parent arrived in 1849 to see if they had 3 children or 4 children with them. Unfortunately, no passenger list has since been located and the indices all probably have the surname badly misspelled making the search all that more difficult.

Mt best guess is that Peter was merely a small newborn infant that traveled with the parents when they left Ireland. Thus his birth location was Ireland and not Illinois.

Contrary to the information that appears on the Find-A-Grave memorial created by others (http://www.findagrave.com/cgi-bin/fg.cgi?page=gr&GRid=72438710), there is no evidence or documentation that Peter was born in Nov 1850 in County Tyrone, Northern Ireland.

The first problem with that statement is that there was no such place as "Northern Ireland" in the 1800s. Ireland was not divided until 1921 by an act of the British parliament.

The next problem concerns the date of birth as Nov 1850. As previously mentioned, given the fact that both of his parents emigrated from Ireland in 1849, it would be impossible for him to have been born anywhere in Ireland in Nov 1850.

And next, concerns the birth location being falsely presented as County Tyrone. While there is some documentary evidence that many of the Drugan family members and other relatives were from County Tyrone, there is absolutely no evidence or source documentation that suggests the Peter was ever born there in 1846, 1849, or 1850, ignoring for the time being the fact that his parents had already left Ireland in 1849.

In addition, the FAG page states that Peter came to America with his family in 1859, another incorrect date. Both parents left Ireland in 1849. Their youngest son, Charles, a brother to Peter, was born in Illinois in 1852. The fact that this page contains a link to the Charles Drugan page which provides his birth date and location in 1852 in Illinois just boggles the mind of a rational person as to how any person could publish such blatantly false information. To make matters even worse, the person who maintains the information on the Charles Drugan page (which shows a birth date of 1852 in Illinois) is the same person that maintains the page for his brother, Peter, upon which he claims the Drugans didn't arrive in America until 1859.

This particular memorialization on Find-A-Grave with incorrect dates and locations being presented as facts is a prime example of why many genealogist put any of the FAG pages at a very low level of reliability.

demands for his bride were met with refusal by the parents, who said their daughter was under age and that legal steps to annul the marriage could be taken. The officer of the law, it is said, also refused to assist the groom in this attempt. The latest report is that the parents have consented to the match, but that Drugan and Jones imagining they have got into trouble have gone west. SHE WAS DRUGGED HOW A TREMPEALEAU LADY ENTERED THE MATRIMONIAL STATE

Hattie Oakes Brings Suit Against Joseph Drugan, the Man Who thus Imposed Upon her, But he Cannot be Found --- former Reference to this Case.

On the 8th of December THE REPUBLICAN published a story from Trempealeau regarding the marriage of Miss Hattie Oakes and Mr. Jos. Drugan, in which it was stated, on one side that the marriage was in the nature of an elopement, and that the girl's brother had torn her away from her husband by the use of a revolver, and on the other side that the girl had been kidnapped and married as the result of a conspiracy. The latter story seems to have been the correct one, as the young lady --- who resides with her widowed mother on a small farm lying between Trempealeau and Galesville --- has this week appeared before G. O. McGilvray, a justice of the peace, and made an affidavit to the following story:

"On Sunday, November 25, I was prevailed upon by Frank Jones and his wife to go (to their) house on the pretext that my services were needed. A man by the name of Joseph Drugan was there. He was an entire stranger to me. Jones and his wife began by praising up Mr. Drugan as a nice fellow, and after a time he asked me to marry him, but I refused. On the following Monday I felt strangely, and in the evening was taken by Mr. and Mrs. Jones and Drugan before W. H. Gibson, a justice of the peace at Trempealeau, where Drugan swore that I was 19 years of age. I knew but little of what was transpiring about me, but later on I learned that I had been married to Drugan by Gibson. I was taken back to Jones's house and kept there three days by the Joneses and Drugan. On Friday Jones and Drugan went to Trempealeau, leaving instruction not to allow me out of the house. I improved my opportunities, however, and escaped to the home of my mother. It was some time before I felt right in my head."

The theory is that Miss Oakes was drugged at the supper table in Jones's and her friends were in a frenzy when they learned of the outrage which had been visited upon her. Steps were immediately taken to effect the arrest and punishment of Drugan, but when they searched for him they found that he had fled, and his whereabouts are still unknown.

The young woman will now ask the courts for a release from the matrimonial bonds placed upon her, and to that end has engaged Attorney Wyatt H. Graves, of La Crosse.



Researcher Dale Ebersold provides the following information: Gravesite mystery:

Row 6, the far right (east) row has a more complicated arrangements of lots and graves than the other 5 rows. Row 6 starts as a two grave wide row at the top (north) end beginning with Lot 62 working down toward the bottom (south) end of the row where the last two lots, 69 & 70, become single grave wide lots. As of this update, Lots 69 & 70 are both covered with trees, brush and high weeds. The old database Lot Map shows Lot 69 contains 4 parallel grave sites and Lot 70 contains 2 parallel grave sites. The old database List of Lot Owners show Lot 69 to be owned by Henry Shrake and Lot 70 shown as "Empty."

Now begins some unresolved accounting issues. The old database List of Burials show Matt Frasch [1858-1937] to be buried in Lot 69, grave 1 and his wife Mary (Stiller) [1868-1928] buried in Lot 69, grave 2 and no one buried in graves 3 & 4. But according to the old database List of Owners, this lot is owned by Henry William Shrake. The old database List of Burials show Henry William Shrake [1866-1934] to be buried in Lot 70, grave 1 and his wife Margaret Ann (Drugan) Shrake buried in Lot 70, grave 2. The individual grave markers for the Frasch's and the combined single grave marker for the Shrake's are still very easy to read and are located in the open maintained section of the cemetery, not in the overgrown area of Lots 69 & 70. When the lot markers 68, 69 & 70 were uncovered in October 2012, it was clear that the Frasch's grave markers and the Shrake's combined grave marker are located in Lot 68 which according to the old database List of Owners is owned by Edmund Drugan. The old database Lot Map shows Lot 68 to be a two graves wide lot containing 14 grave sites, 1-7 on the left and 8-14 on the right. The old database List of Burials does not shown anyone buried in any of the 14 grave sites.

So, are the remains under their respective grave markers or were the grave markers moved to an open area of the cemetery? Other errors and omissions have been found in the old database. Hopefully this mystery can be solved.

General Notes:

This is my great-grandfather and yet I have no real photographs of him aside from the one which supposedly shows him sitting down in a chair with another man standing over him. I have asked the Drugan family relatives repeatedly to confirm that David Drugan is indeed the one that was sitting down in the chair but none of the family members have ever responded in the affirmative. I have asked for copies of other photographs of David but have received nothing but promises. Strange, because the Drugan family has a culture of promoting photographs of family members. (Brian L. Lightfoot)

David Sr. was called Drowsy because as a brakeman for the railroad and he fell asleep on one of his routes. His son, Jack, can still remember how his dad would say "Trempealeau...Trempealeau", as the train came into the station. The nickname of Drowsy stuck and it wasn't long before David Jr. was also called that.

Most documents give a birth year of 1889 but there are some that give 1888. The Drugan Family records provide a birth year of 1889 which is the date on his gravestone. One of the earliest records was his World War I Draft Registration Card that he signed and it gave a birth year of 1889.

Other than family records, there apparently is no official document which shows his middle name spelled as either Glen or Glenn. The 1910 Census does shows it spelled as Glenn and the published wedding announcement also showed it spelled as Glenn. However, another local newspaper article detailing family visits in the area spelled it as Glen in 1921 but that was probably just the reporter or newspaper's editor error in spelling. Many newspaper articles show his name as D. G. Drugan. Birth certificates for his son, David Jr, show his middle name spelled as Glenn thus it must be assumed that the father's middle name was spelled the same.

THE LIFE OF DAVID GLENN DRUGAN

By Robert C. Westphal, Jr. (Grandson)

Compiled in part during personal interviews in 1977, while staying with Lena (Hanson Drugan) and Vinson Rice, Winona, MN

FORWARD

My grandfather, David Glenn Drugan, died long before I was born. I know him only through photographs and family stories that have been passed d own over the years. Through these small fragments of information that have been (and are continuing to be) assembled by my cousin Brian Lightfoot and myself, I'm finally getting to know the man that was my mother's father.

Through stories told to me by my grandmother, Lena (Hanson) Drugan, I have found that David was a man of quiet courage and strength, a man that could be counted on through the worst of times. Simple fate dictated that he was to become a father of seven children during the worst economic disaster in American history. The constant struggle to support his family must have been an overwhelming challenge, but it's clearly evident that his priorities of God, family and friendships were something that he never lost sight of.

After being diagnosed with stomach cancer in 1928, he knew, beyond a doubt, that he was living on borrowed time. The stress of knowing that his young family would be left behind to fare for themselves weighed heavily upon him in his remaining years. His story is far from complete, and we, his ancestors, will never know how difficult it was for him to be a father, a husband, a friend, and a provider while battling such a horrific disease. The memories of his children all center around his strength and determination, yet one small recollection of his daughter, Martha, tells the story of a man that felt alone and defeated in his fight for life:

"...dad would take me, alone, on Sunday mornings to church, each time to a church of a different denomination while everyone else attended mass at St. Thomas. I think dad was looking for peace and looking for answers. I saw him begin to cry walking out of church one Sunday. He scooped me up in his arms and held me so tightly that it hurt. He knew he was dying and the church offered him little, if any comfort. The priests were too busy catering to the wealthy in the parish to be concerned about dad and his poverty stricken family."

To conclude that David lost faith in God would be a grave error. Rather, he likely lost faith in himself and in his ability to care for his family. His biggest question was likely centered around what would become of his wife and children, rather than what would become of him or his salvation. Unfortunate as it may seem, we will all be at this cross roads at some point in life, facing death on an intimate level. The valuable insight that David's history has given me is a simple message -- don't

take a single moment of life for granted... this day may, in fact, be your last. Lena, his wife, recalled, "Your grandpa never gave up. I s'pose anyone would become withdrawn and scared when time was getting so short. But he still found the strength to play with the kids and go to work every day until he couldn't move from the bed."

A sad story? In many respects, yes. But the memories David has left behind are priceless reminders about the immeasurable value of the time we're each allotted in this life, and the challenges we must overcome to reach our ultimate destiny with courage and faith.

EARLY LIFE AND FAMILY

David Glenn Drugan was born February 24, 1889 in Trempealeau, Trempealeau County, Wisconsin, then a small village of approx. 500 inhabitants situated on the Mississippi River, approx. 10 miles north of the city of La Crosse.

His father, Patrick Drugan, Jr., born October 12, 1845 in County Tyrone, Ireland, worked as a quarryman and day laborer at the time of David's birth, and his mother, Elizabeth Jane Keeffe was a housewife. David's ancestors were of northern Irish stock, and were some of the first settlers in the Trempealeau area in the mid-1800s, having emigrated from County Tyrone in northern Ireland in 1848. David's mother was also of Irish heritage, and was born June 24, 1854 in Kemptville, Ontario, Canada, her parents having emigrated to Ontario from County Cork, in southern Ireland. The Drugan's were Roman Catholic and attended church at St. Bartholomew's Catholic Parish in Trempealeau.

David was the third of five children, including siblings:

- ---Edmund Drugan, born December 19, 1879 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin
- ---William John Drugan, born July 11, 1882 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin
- ---Harry Roy Drugan, born December 15, 1890 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin
- ---Anne Elizabeth Drugan, born December 23, 1895 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin

EDUCATION

David was educated at local schools in Trempealeau, and graduated from Trempealeau high school in 1906. About 1907, he took employment as a railroad brakeman with the Chicago & Northwestern Railway, and by 1910 was living with several of his coworkers in Elroy, Wisconsin, a small town in Juneau County. The rail routes he traveled ranged from Winona, Minnesota to Chicago, working at first on freight trains, and for the remainder of his career on passenger trains.

David did not participate in the military service, despite WWI coming about. Many railroad employees, factory workers, and others who indirectly contributed to the war effort were not drafted.

MARRIAGE

On April 21, 1913, at the courthouse in Winona, MN, David married Lena L . Hanson, born March 19, 1894 in Trempealeau, WI to Louis Hanson and Lena Kramer. When asked about her wedding, Lena (Hanson) Drugan replied, "Well, back then your grandpa was catholic and I, of course, was raised in the Methodist church. Both of our families wanted us to be married in their own church, you know. Well, we didn't want to cause an argument, so your grandpa had the idea to get married at the courthouse and figure the rest out later! And so we did; thankfully too, with blessings from both our families."

MOVE TO CHICAGO

David and Lena's first residence was in the Irving Park neighborhood of Chicago, approx. 4 miles northwest of downtown. David and Lena lived within walking distance of the railroad depot where David worked. When asked about living in Chicago as newlyweds, Lena (Hanson) Drugan replied, "Oh, my, those were exciting times! We went all the way to Chicago by train with all our belongings aboard, which weren't much, but the Northwestern paid for everything, even the food in the dining car. Irving Park was a very nice place with lots of big beautiful homes and parks. We hadn't lived there long when your grandpa took me to a big fireworks show at Independence Park, on the 4th of July. Of course, being from a small place like Trempealeau, I'd never seen anything like that in my life! There were hundreds of people there and also a big carnival where your grandpa entered a ball pitching contest and won a coupon for \$5.00 worth of groceries - and that was a big deal back then. We didn't have a car yet, so we walked everywhere or took the train. One time we went downtown (Chicago) and had a picnic on the lakefront with a beautiful view of the lake on one side and all of the big buildings on the other side. There was so much to see and do that we didn't have time to be home sick!"

MOVE TO WINONA, MN

After less than a year in Chicago, David was transferred to Winona, Minnesota, and the couple made their home at 467 E. Fourth St., Winona. David continued his work as a brakeman for Chicago & Northwestern, and began to make regular runs from Winona to Baraboo, Wisconsin and back. When asked about David's job, Lena (Hanson) Drugan said, "He liked his job with the railroad and made good money, benefits and such, but didn't really want to take a spot as an engineer, although he easily could have. You see, in those days the engineers traveled almost constantly. They called the wives of engineers "railroad widows" because their husbands were never, or almost never home. So your grandpa stayed put as a brakeman. He liked the job and was very well liked by the men he worked with."

The birth of their first daughter, Catherine "Bernice" came in 1915. Lena said she would often board the train in Winona in the morning, and ride to Trempealeau with David, who then went on to Baraboo (and back). This gave her much needed time with her mother as she was learning the ropes of new motherhood. "Your grandpa was such a good father. Through the years, he was always patient and loving with our kids, all of them. Even when he'd come home tired and dragging after a long day at work, he'd spend time with them. He was a pretty quiet and even tempered guy, you know, much like your uncle David. Oh, he had an Irish temper though, that came out at work at times! But, you know, home was his serenity, even with all the kids running around."

On one occasion, David received the honor of being appointed as brakeman on President Calvin Coolidge's train, transcript of memo as follows:

Baraboo, Wis., Sept. 8th, 1927. Mr. D. G. Drugan, Brakeman Mr. L. C. Stephens, Brakeman

You will be used on the President Coolidge train, Winona to Elroy, Saturday p.m. Please see that your uniform etc. is in first class condition. A man will be furnished to relieve you on your regular assignment Saturday.

W. J. Keating Asst. Superintendent. (Chicago & Northwestern Railway)

THE GREAT DEPRESSION YEARS

During the depression, David maintained his position with Chicago & Northwestern. Despite the modest pay of a brakeman, at least he was employed and not in constant fear of losing his job. But, having to make ends meet with seven children to feed was not an easy task, even in the best of times. The family relocated (within Winona) frequently, never saving enough money to purchase a home. Martha (Drugan) Westphal said, "It seemed like we were always moving. I can remember going with dad to rent a house one time. I was about 7 years old. Dad told me not to say anything to the landlord about how many brothers and sisters I had. He told the landlord that he had three kids! Obviously, nobody wanted to rent a house to such a big family. I remember one time when a landlord came by to collect the rent. The guy was a real jerk. He pulled up at the curb, saw all of us kids playing in the front yard and asked dad who all the kids belonged to. Dad just smiled and said, matter-of-factly, "oh, those kids? A couple are mine and the rest belong to the neighborhood!" It wasn't long before we were moving again, after finding an eviction notice on the front door. Funny thing was, Ma would worry constantly, but dad would always take it all in stride. Nothing ever seemed to bother him. He was always on an even keel."

FAMILY TIES AND HOLIDAYS

David remained close to his parents throughout his life, and in their later years, often devoted weekends to traveling across the river to Trempealeau and helping them with household chores and tending to their personal needs. His mother passed away in 1915, and it is said that this was a crushing blow to him. He always said that at least his mother got to hold one of his children before her death.

Having a large family on a limited income, especially during the depression, had its pitfalls for David and Lena. David would cut Christmas trees right out of the woods and bring them home on the train from Trempealeau. Ornaments were hand-made and often just pictures cut out of old magazines and catalogs and tied to the tree with string. The tree was lit with small candles on Christmas eve only. Christmas dinner usually consisted of a ham or a turkey that David would "commandeer" through his connections on the railroad, or, as was the case during several Christmas' (and weather

permitting), the family would spend Christmas in Trempealeau with Lena's parents who were much better off financially. For months prior to Christmas, David would retire to the basement after work, and hand carve small wooden toys for his children. Martha (Drugan) Westphal recalls, "When I was 8 years old, my dad gave me the best gift ever - a small hand-carved wooden baby cradle that he made himself. It was painted pink and baby blue, and had a little painted rose on the head board. When my dad gave it to me, I was so happy that I jumped into his arms and cried! In fact, I cried so hard that I made dad cry! I only had one doll in my life, a "Flossie Flirt," doll that was another gift from dad. Out of all the kids, the girls anyway, I was dad's favorite even though he took great pains not to have favorites. He just spent more time with me, especially after he got sick."

Birthday parties were very small scale occasions, with children's gifts usually consisting a something practical like a hand-me-down coat, a reconditioned pair of shoes, or a pair of mended and re-mended socks; things that would have otherwise been looked at simply as necessities. The only time during the year that David and Lena went out on the town together was on the occasion of Lena's birthday, March 19th. Lena recalls this as the only day of the year that the couple would eat dinner "out" or have a glass of wine or beer. "Your grandpa was a very handsome fellow! On my birthday, we would get dressed up and go out on the town; he looked like a movie star and was such a gentleman. One time, his brother Ed and his wife Mary came with us, and, oh what a good time we all had dancing, even though your grandpa had two left feet on the dance floor and was always shy when it came to dancing!" - recalled Lena.

HOBBIES

David enjoyed wood carving, gardening, and took great pride in raising homing pigeons and exotic chickens that he often showed at the county fairs in both Winona and Trempealeau. In competitions, he often received first or second place. Martha (Drugan) Westphal recalls her father coming home from work with big pocketful of cracked corn and bird seed that he'd pick up from grain cars on railroad sidings to feed his birds with. He'd build chicken coupes and pigeon cages out of old railroad freight boxes that were housed in the basement during the cold winter months. "Dad would often spend hours out in the backyard with the pigeons and chickens, making sure they were well cared for. We always had a little garden too, and dad would carefully dig up and transplant everything he could every time we had to move!" - said Martha (Drugan) Westphal.

RELIGION

Despite his strict catholic upbringing, David went to church periodically, usually on the important catholic holy days of obligation. Martha (Drugan) Westphal recalls, "Dad and Ma saw to it that each one of us was baptized and confirmed in the catholic church. We always prayed before meals and before bed. Old Father O'Day once said to dad (as he entered the front door of St. Thomas Church), "I'm glad to see you finally found time to make it to mass, Mr. Drugan." At that time, dad was struggling with cancer and was so sick and tired he could hardly walk. Dad, without saying a word to the priest, walked into church holding my hand and muttered, "a-hole." For months and months after that, dad would take me, alone, on Sunday mornings to church, each time to a church of a different denomination while everyone else attended mass at St. Thomas. I think dad was looking for peace and looking for answers. I saw him begin to cry walking out of church one Sunday. He scooped me up in his arms and held me so tightly that it hurt. He knew he was dying and the church offered him little, if any comfort. The priests were too busy catering to the wealthy in the parish to be concerned about dad and his poverty stricken family."

FINAL DAYS

David's final years were spent trying hard to conceal the physical pain and mental anguish of stomach cancer. He'd underwent an operation in Rochester, Minnesota in late 1928 that allowed him to live another five years, years that he spent in and out of hospitals and in great mental and physical pain. Martha (Drugan) Westphal indicated that he'd come home from work and literally collapse on the sofa, exhausted. "Dad would motion me to come and rub his shoulders, and I'd do so until my little hands hurt. I didn't know there was anything wrong with him, but toward the end, noticed that he wasn't eating much except soup and that he'd lost so much weight that Ma had to alter his railroad uniform regularly. When I'd rub his back and shoulders, I could feel every bone in his body. It wasn't long after that that he died. Even at his funeral, I was too young to realize that he was never going to come back. Weeks passed before I really felt the sadness set in. I missed him so much; it hurt so badly. And, I don't know how, but Ma managed to be there for every one of us. I think dad's death was a lot harder on Ma and the older kids. Dad's many friends, co-workers from the railroad, were all very helpful in our time of need. Especially dad's best friend, Ori Dubois who put his whole life on hold to make sure Ma and all us kids were well taken care of. What a good man he was." Lena, his wife, recalled, "Your grandpa never gave up. I s'pose anyone would become withdrawn and scared when time was getting so short, but he never complained or never let on that he was bad. He still found the strength to play with the kids and go to work right up until he couldn't move from the bed."

David died, at the young age of 45, on October 6th 1934 and was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery, Winona, Minnesota two days later. The memories of this remarkable man have survived for decades through his children, grandchildren, and beyond. Though his life was brief in years, his mark of strength and determination through the most difficult of circumstances is something each and every one of us will always admire and cherish.

All the Drugan children went to Madison School in Winona for elementary school. Jack Drugan said he went to Lincoln school for only two months, when they moved to Mill Street for a short time. They had to move because his brother, Billy, age 4, was playing with matches in the attic and there was a fire. Not much damage, but some smoke damage.

A most interesting article was found in the 11 June 1927 edition of the Winona Republican-Herald newspaper. It detailed a special children's program that was being given by the McKinley Methodist Church and it listed Bernice, Ruth, and Margaret Drugan all as participants. It was commonly believed amongst the Drugan family that following the marriage to David Glenn Drugan, Lena Hanson left her Methodist upbringing and raised all her children in the catholic church but this article would seem to show otherwise.

Trempealeau - Glenn Drugan of Winona moved his family here last Tuesday in the A. A. Holmes house on Third Street.

My cousin and fellow researcher, Robert C. Westphal, writes the following biography about Lena Hanson.

THE LIFE OF LENA HANSON

By Robert C. Westphal, Jr. (Grandson)

Compiled in part during personal interviews in 1977, while staying with Lena (Hanson Drugan) and Vinson Rice, Winona, MN

FORWARD

Living in Pleasanton, CA at the time, I had gone to Winona in the Spring of 1977 to look into attending Winona State University and planned to stop off and visit my grandparents for a few days. The day after my arrival, grandma woke up at 3 o'clock in the morning complaining of a severe burning sensation in her stomach. Against her wishes, I called an ambulance and she was taken to Winona General Hospital. They performed X -rays and determined that she had an aortic aneurysm and that it was life threatening. She was transferred, by ambulance, to the Mayo Clinic in nearby Rochester, MN, and immediately underwent cardiac surgery at St. Mary's - Mayo to repair the weak spot in her aorta. The surgery was successful, but her surgeon later indicated that had surgery been postponed for another half an hour, she would have "bled out" and died.

Whitey and I stayed for a week in a nearby motel while Lena recovered. Then, on the day she was scheduled to go home, she tried to get out of bed without assistance, and fell, breaking her hip. Another (hip replacement) surgery was planned for the following week. Whitey and I returned home to Winona where we lived as "bachelors" for the next two weeks - while grandma recovered in Rochester. She did very well through the surgeries, and was released early under the condition that I would remain in Winona to help care for her over the next month.

During her recovery, we spent many hours talking about her life. I documented most of the "high points," and have countless pages of other little stories that she told. It was difficult caring for both of them; constant cooking, bathing, medications, doctor's visits, etc., but the experience gave me, at 19 years old, the valuable opportunity to know my grandparents on a very personal level. As a child, I was a "grandma's boy," spending far more time with grandma than with grandpa during visits to Winona. But, this time with them allowed me to really develop a deeper relationship with grandpa (Whitey). Despite his gruff exterior, I found him to be a wonderful man with a heart of pure gold. We went bowling together every week, played checkers together, took long walks together, went for drives around Lake Winona, and went grocery shopping together. It was evident that he was scared to death to lose his wife, and I'm so happy to have been there for both of them to offer what comfort I could.

When grandma died, it was decided that I would be the one to tell Whitey of her death. It was among the most difficult things I've had to do in my life. When I told him, (while he was living as a patient in the Watkins Home, Winona), he clutched my hand and said, "Oh, no... oh no. I love her so much. I explained to him how much suffering she had been going through, and how she was now in God's hands and suffering no more. I sat and held him for hours, and, at one point, he looked up at me and said, "At least we have each other, Robby." Those words meant the world to me.

It would be impossible to convey the love and respect I had for these two dynamic people -- people that have given me the gift of so many beautiful memories. Genealogy is, for me, so much more than dates, places and records. It's a collection of cherished memories that seem to become much more vivid as one ages. Through these small histories, we can better survive our own challenges in life by learning from the countless examples of both triumph and tragedy left behind by our ancestors.

EARLY LIFE AND FAMILY

Lena Louise Hanson was born March 19, 1894 in Trempealeau, Trempealeau County, Wisconsin, then a small village of approx. 500 inhabitants situated on the Mississippi River, approx. 10 miles north of the city of La Crosse.

Her father, Louis Hanson, (aka Lars Syversen Hanson) was born December 2 7, 1855 in Klanderudtangen, Eidskog, Hedmark, Norway, and, at the time of Lena's birth, owned and operated a shop in Trempealeau that made harnesses, shoes, tanned leather and also sold and repaired bicycles. Her mother, Lena Catherine Kramer, born July 25, 1855 in Lewiston, Winona County, Minnesota, was a homemaker. Lena's paternal ancestors were of Norwegian ancestry, and her maternal ancestors were of German ancestry. Lena was baptized on April 5, 1895 at the Trempealeau Methodist Church, Trempealeau, Wisconsin, where the family attended services regularly.

Lena was the second of four children, including siblings:

Harry Louis Hanson, born October 26, 1899 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin Martha Louise "Mattie" Hanson, born March 12, 1897 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin Marie Lydia Hanson, born November 1, 1905 in Trempealeau, Wisconsin

When asked about her childhood in Trempealeau, Lena said, "Oh, my gosh, I have so many good memories of when I was a little girl! Back then, Trempealeau was a bustling little town; lots to see and do; not like today. It's become a ghost town! I was never bored, that's for sure. Along the river there were always steamboats, big paddlewheelers coming and going - lots of people on the streets shopping and doing their business, you know. I used to just love walking into my dad's shop - it smelled so good, just like leather and pipe tobacco. In those days, bicycles were the fashion, so there were always lots of people standing in the window of my dad's shop looking at the bicycles and posters. I can remember dad riding a bicycle to and from work when the weather was nice. All of us kids had bicycles too, you know, but back then most of the streets were either gravel, dirt or brick and it seemed like we were always coming home with skinned knees and elbows!

My father was just a wonderful man. He wore a big red handlebar moustache, which was sort of odd because he had brown hair. He was always good natured and everyone in town liked him. Oh, and he was a wonderful gardener. We had a big garden behind our house; well, actually two gardens, one for flowers and one for vegetables. In the flower garden my mother always had roses, zinnia's, hollyhocks, tulips, and every sort of beautiful thing that she'd cut and decorate the table with. My dad kept the vegetables. He grew the sweetest watermelons and cantaloupe, and pole beans that climbed these tall stake contraptions on wire. We had sweet corn, peas, carrots, onions, and cabbage and broccoli in the cooler season. And my Ma kept busy canning everything that dad grew, so we had vegetables in the winter too. And in those days, some people thought tomatoes were poisonous! But my dad grew tomatoes that were as big as softballs and oh so sweet! Not many people maintained their homes like my father did ours. Even our grass, you know, the lawns, were always cut short and neat - never a leaf or blade of grass out of place.

My Ma, well, she was the disciplinarian. Where dad was quiet and reserved, Ma was just a whirling dervish! She always had to be moving or doing something, and I can still hear my dad's voice saying, "Lena, come and sit down, you're making the cat nervous!" My dad, well he was always big on education and saw to it that we did our studies. He read a lot and was especially fond of poetry. He kept a library of books in a big cupboard with glass doors in the parlor. In the evenings, we'd sit on the floor, dad on the chesterfield, and he'd read to us and tell stories. Oh, my what a good storyteller he was! While dad was reading, Ma would sit and play the piano, and later the organ, and sing hymns. When Ma got too loud, dad would stop reading and stare at her until he got her attention - Ma would stop, wave her hand, shake her head, and start playing again, this time a little quieter! This always made us kids laugh and laugh; oh how we'd laugh at those two!"

When asked about hobbies, holidays and free time, Lena recalled, "Well, we certainly didn't have television, radios and all the modern things we have now, but we were never bored. There was always something to do. I played baseball, and so did Harry. Marie and Mattie, well they were more ladylike - I was a tomboy just like your Ma was when she was a girl! I loved baseball and was a very good pitcher. We had leagues back then, and even uniforms. I played for Trempealeau, but we spelled it "Tremplo" on our uniforms because the name was too long. And, let's see, geez, I played for Ettrick too. We played against teams from Dodge, Galesville and Arcadia, teams from all over. It was quite a big deal back then, baseball was. The whole town would turnout to watch a game and everyone would bring food and soda pop for afterwards.

And, of course, like all girls, my Ma taught me to cook, sew, knit, crochet and keep house from the time I was old enough to walk. My Ma, you see, she was a very good seamstress and we always had nice clothes. She would

order big bolts of fabric from the General Store and made everything from curtains to tablecloths and bed linens to clothes. And my how that woman kept a clean house! But in those days we didn't have electricity and there weren't vacuum cleaners yet. So we had a mud porch, as we called it, where you would take your shoes off and put house slippers on before coming inside. This kept the rugs clean and the dust down. To clean rugs, Ma would take them into the backyard in the Spring and beat them with a long wire wand to get the dust out.

We didn't take vacations like people do today. Most people planned what we called "outings" that were held in the summer where families and friends would pick a spot and get together for the day. Every so often, we'd go to Perrot Park and have a big family doings. Our whole big extended family was there. We fished, played games, went hiking and ate. So much food! This kept us all in touch and afterward we'd write letters and send post cards to each other. My Ma was always a good organizer of these events too.

Oh, yeah, and holidays; we had Christmas trees and every sort of decoration at Christmas time. We'd all go into the woods to a spot across from the cemetery and cut our Christmas tree and then tow it back home behind my dad's horse driven sleigh. Since dad was in the harness business, he fashioned some very ornate reins with sleigh bells on them. People used to say that they could hear the Hanson's coming from a mile away!

Ma was very particular about decorating the tree. We had beautiful glass ornaments and little candle holders that clipped to the branches. On Christmas Eve, dad would light the candles on the tree while Ma stood by with a bucket of water in case of a fire! Us kids weren't allowed to see the tree until it was decorated and all the candles were lit. This was on Christmas eve only. You seem we'd have to stay upstairs until Ma called us down to "see Christmas." And then we'd eat dinner, usually baked fish, which was our tradition I s'pose. Ma was a very good cook; mostly German food, and we ate a lot of fresh fish and vegetables. So, then, after Christmas Eve dinner, we would have prayers and dad would tell the Christmas story. I don't recall hearing the name Santa Claus until I was older. We were told the story of "Father Christmas," who was St. Nicholas. After the children were asleep, Father Christmas would come and leave little gifts in your stocking (which we tacked up on the mantel piece over the fireplace in the parlor the night before). The next morning, Christmas morning, we would race downstairs to see what was in our stockings. There was always gumdrops, nuts, peppermint candies and coins. If you were a bad girl or boy, Father Christmas would leave willow switches and lumps of coal in your stocking! Luckily, this never happened in our house and I never heard of it happening to anyone else! The stockings would stay up until "Silvester," which is what we, and other German families called New Year's Eve. I'm not sure anymore, but I think this had to do with Saint Sylvester and was some sort of German tradition of my Ma's. New Year's Eve dinner was always split pea soup and sausages. We were allowed to stay up until midnight, when everyone would run out into the street and yell Happy New Year or Gutes Neues Jahr! Ma would give each of us kids big spoons and pots to take outside and make noise! While we were outside, dad and Ma would put dried fruit and nuts in our stockings, along with small tins of licorice.

Then, on Christmas day, we would exchange small gifts. I remember getting dolls, porcelain dolls that were beautiful. Those were the "girl gifts." Mother would hand stitch and embroider their clothes. Harry would get toy guns, little metal motorcars, and trains, "boy gifts." Ma and dad would exchange gifts too. It seemed that Ma always bought a tin of pipe tobacco for dad, and dad always bought jewelry for Ma. After gifts, we'd have prayers of thanks, and then sit down to a big Christmas dinner. Uncle Hans and auntie Tillie were always there Christmas Day, along with other family and friends. Ma would start cooking the Christmas meal at 3 in the morning. We always had a Christmas goose, mashed potatoes, apple stuffing, and cranberry sauce. In Norwegian tradition, dad always ate dessert first, before the main meal. Christmas was the only day us kids were allowed to eat dessert first! Ma made pies, tortes, strudel, lebkuchen, gingerbread; enough sweets to feed an army! Dad didn't eat sweets very often unless they were chocolate. He loved chocolate. Long after everyone had finished their meal, dad would still be at the table. He ate slower than anyone I ever knew! He always said, "...if you chew your food 100 times, you will never have a belly ache!" Ma, on the other hand, ate like she was in a race, and always ate like a bird. Like dad, she had a weakness for chocolate and had a good number of hiding places for it throughout the house!

At Easter, well, we had the "Easter Bunny" tradition and the town would have Easter egg hunts at the park. Ma would make small candy baskets for us, with chocolate bunnies, colored eggs, and cookies decorated like flowers. We'd make bonfires in the street in front of the house the night before Easter Sunday, as would many other families. This seemed to be a tradition of my dad, who said it symbolized the warmth and coming of spring, even though the fire would often be burning on an a patch of ice! Easter was a big church celebration where we performed dances

and such after services, and then went home and always had a lamb dinner. Ma would even bake a sweet cake in the shape of a lamb, and we'd joke, "cut me a leg, please", "I'll have an eyeball, please", "I'll take a bite of the tail, please!" - and so on! My father loved to eat homemade mint jelly with his lamb, which I thought was just disgusting!

The 4th of July was always a big event, and we had parades that most everyone took part in. We'd start down by the river and go through town. Most of the businesses would open their doors and serve soda pop and cider. My dad would always dress up in costume and ride a bicycle in the parade; I s'pose he was advertising! We had fireworks that were just amazing, fired off from the riverbank next to the railroad tracks and shot out over the river. One year, a big paddleboat anchored offshore to watch the fireworks, and my brother Harry won a ticket and took me with him. I was beautiful, just beautiful. There always seemed to be a big picnic going on for one holiday or another. During the summer, since we didn't have electric fans or air conditioning like nowadays, most people spent time outdoors where it was cooler. Oh, and I can remember my dad volunteering for the job of "lamplighter." We had several gas street lamps, or maybe they were kerosene, that were lit at night downtown. Men from the community would volunteer to light the lamps and then extinguish them in the early morning hours. I went with my dad, as a young girl, to light the lamps. I thought it was such an important job! Life was so simple then.

Also, one, or I should say two - other holidays that are important to mention were Halloween and Thanksgiving. Halloween wasn't like it is today. It was more of a festival. Our family didn't celebrate Halloween, but, as we became more "Americanized" (I s'pose), we did go trick-or-treating from house to house, once that I can recall. But I don't remember dressing up in a costume. This tradition was more popular years later. Thanksgiving was a big holiday though. One year, my aunt, uncle, and cousins came all the way from South Dakota to spend Thanksgiving with us, and ended up staying almost two weeks because of a bad snowstorm. Even the railroad shut down for some time. Ma would spend days and days baking and preparing the meal. We would have turkey, goose, and sometimes even duck too. My dad had a little smokehouse in the back and would always smoke fish for Thanksgiving. He made wonderful sausage too. It always smelled so good when the coals were smoldering for days on end. Thanksgiving and the 4th of July were holidays that my parents seemed to celebrate as Americans, but the other holidays were very, very tradition al Norwegian and German. These were the times, it seemed, that my parents would speak in their native languages, especially when their families were around. My mother would speak nothing but German when her family was there, and my dad would speak nothing but Norwegian around his family."

EDUCATION

Lena was educated in local schools in Trempealeau, and graduated from Trempealeau high school in 1912. She was an excellent student and was offered a scholarship to attend St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. Her career aspirations were to become a school teacher. However, shortly after graduating high school, she met her future husband, David Drugan, and decided not to pursue a college education. Lena recalled, "I enjoyed literature and history the most. But our lessons were well rounded. I took physics, algebra, biology and even Latin. The day I graduated, it was announced that I was eligible, because of my high marks, to attend St. Olaf on scholarship. This was quite a big deal, especially for a girl. I can still remember my dad standing there with tears in his eyes, so proud of me. I wanted to become a teacher, and maybe travel someday to Chicago or New York and see what it was like to live in a big city."

MARRIAGE

On April 21, 1913, at the courthouse in Winona, MN, Lena married David Glenn Drugan, born February 24, 1889 in Trempealeau, WI to Patrick Drugan and Elizabeth Keeffe. When asked about her wedding, Lena replied, "Well, back then your grandpa was Catholic and I, of course, was raised in the Methodist church. Both of our families wanted us to be married in their own church, you know. Well, we didn't want to cause an argument, so your grandpa had the idea to get married at the courthouse and figure the rest out later! And so we did; thankfully too, with blessings from both our families."

MOVE TO CHICAGO

David and Lena's first residence was in the Irving Park neighborhood of Chicago, approx. 4 miles from downtown. David and Lena lived within walking distance of the railroad depot where David worked. When asked about living in Chicago as newlyweds, Lena replied, "Oh, my, those were exciting times! We went all the way to Chicago by train with all our belongings aboard, which weren't much, but the Northwestern paid for everything, even the food

in the dining car. Irving Park was a very nice place with lots of big beautiful homes and parks. We hadn't lived there long when your grandpa took me to a big fireworks show at Independence Park, on the 4th of July. Of course, being from a small place like Trempealeau, I'd never seen anything like that in my life! There were hundreds of people there and also a big carnival where your grandpa entered a ball pitching contest and won a coupon for \$5.00 worth of groceries - and that was a big deal back then. We didn't have a car yet, so we walked everywhere or took the train. One time we went downtown (Chicago) and had a picnic on the lakefront with a beautiful view of the lake on one side and all of the big buildings on the other side. There was so much to see and do that we didn't have time to be homesick!"

MOVE TO WINONA, MN

After less than a year in Chicago, David was transferred to Winona, Minnesota, and the couple made their home at 467 E. Fourth Street. David continued his work as a brakeman for Chicago & Northwestern, and began to make regular runs from Winona to Baraboo, Wisconsin and back. When asked about David's job, Lena said, "He liked his job with the railroad and made good money, benefits and so, but didn't really want to take a spot as an engineer, although he easily could have. You see, in those days the engineers traveled almost constantly. They called the wives of engineers "railroad widows" because their husbands were never, or almost never home. So your grandpa stayed put as a brakeman. He liked the job and was very well liked by the men he worked with."

The birth of their first daughter, Catherine "Bernice" came in 1915. Lena said she would often board the train in Winona in the morning, and ride to Trempealeau with David, who then went on to Baraboo (and back). This gave her much needed time with her mother as she was learning the ropes of new motherhood. "Your grandpa was such a good father. Through the years, he was always patient and loving with our kids, all of them. Even when he'd come home tired and dragging after a long day at work, he'd spend time with them. He was a pretty quiet and even tempered guy, you know, much like your uncle David. Oh, he had an Irish temper though, that came out at work at times! But, you know, home was his serenity, even with all the kids running around."

In order of birth, David and Lena had the following children:

THE GREAT DEPRESSION YEARS

During the depression, David maintained his position with Chicago & Northwestern. Despite the modest pay of a brakeman, at least he was employed and not in constant fear of losing his job. But, having to make ends meet with seven children to feed was not an easy task, even in the best of times. The family moved (within Winona) frequently, never saving enough money to purchase a home. Martha (Drugan) Westphal said, "It seemed like we were always moving. I can remember going with dad to rent a house one time. I was about 7 years old. Dad told me not to say anything to the landlord about how many brothers and sisters I had. He told the landlord that he had three kids! Obviously, nobody wanted to rent a house to such a big family. I remember one time when a landlord came by to collect the rent. The guy was a real jerk. He pulled up at the curb, saw all of us kids playing in the front yard and asked dad who all the kids belonged to. Dad just said, matter-of-factly, "oh, those kids? A couple are mine and the rest belong to the neighborhood!" It wasn't long before we were moving again, after finding an eviction notice on the front door. Funny thing was, Ma would worry constantly, but dad would always take it all in stride. Nothing ever seemed to bother him. He was always on an even keel."

FAMILY TIES AND HOLIDAYS

David remained close to his parents throughout his life, and in their later years, often devoted weekends to traveling across the river to Trempealeau and helping them with household chores and caring for their medical needs. His mother passed away in 1915, and it is said that this was a crushing blow to him. He always said that at least his mother got to hold one of his children before her death.

Having a large family on a limited income, especially during the depression had its pitfalls for David and Lena. David would cut Christmas trees right out of the woods and bring them home on the train from Trempealeau. Ornaments were hand-made and often just pictures cut out of old magazines and catalogs and tied to the tree with string. The tree was lit with small candles on Christmas eve. Christmas dinner usually consisted of a ham or a turkey that David would "commandeer" through his connections on the railroad, or, as was the case during several Christmas' (weather permitting), the family would spend Christmas in Trempealeau with Lena's parents who were much better off financially. For months prior to Christmas, David would retire to the basement and hand carve small wooden toys for his children. Martha (Drugan) Westphal recalls, "When I was 8 years old, my dad gave me the best gift ever - a small hand-carved wooden baby cradle that he made himself. It was painted pink and baby blue, and had a little painted rose on the headboard. When my dad gave it to me, I was so happy that I cried! I only had one doll in my life, a "Flossie Flirt," doll that was another gift from dad. Out of all the kids, the girls anyway, I was dad's favorite even though he took great pains not to have favorites. He just spent more time with me, especially after he got sick."

Birthday parties were very small scale occasions, with children's gifts usually consisting a something practical like a used coat, a pair of shoes, or socks - most reconditioned hand-me-downs; things that would have otherwise been purchased as necessities. The only time during the year that David and Lena went out on the town together was on the occasion of Lena's birthday, March 19th. Lena recalls this as the only day of the year that the couple would eat dinner "out" or have a glass of wine or beer. "Your grandpa was a very handsome fellow! On my birthday, we would get dressed up and go out on the town; he looked like a movie star and was such a gentleman. One time, his brother Ed and his wife Mary came with us, and what a good time we had dancing, even though your grandpa had two left feet on the dance floor and was always shy when it came to dancing!" recalled Lena, "But, oh, what a dashing man he was!"

HOBBIES

Lena was an avid seamstress and loved to crochet, needlepoint, and knit. She was also an avid letter writer, and kept in touch with family members regularly. Lena recalled, "Between grandpa and I, we had hundreds of relatives scattered all over the place! I always took care to keep in touch with everyone, especially those that lived far away, you know, out of state and such." David enjoyed wood carving, gardening, and took great pride in raising homing pigeons and exotic chickens that he often showed at the county fair. In competitions, he often received first or second place. Martha (Drugan) Westphal recalls her father coming home from work with big pocketful of cracked corn and bird seed that he'd pick up from grain cars on railroad sidings to feed his birds with. "He'd build chicken coupes and pigeon cages out of old railroad freight boxes that were housed in the basement during the cold winter months. Dad would spend hours out in the backyard with the pigeons and chickens, making sure they were well cared for. We always had a little garden too, and dad would carefully dig up and transplant everything he could every time we had to move!" said Martha (Drugan) Westphal.

RELIGION

Despite his strict catholic upbringing, David went to church periodically, usually on the important catholic holy days of obligation. Martha (Drugan) Westphal recalls, "Dad and Ma saw to it that each one of us was baptized and confirmed in the catholic church. We always prayed before meals and before bed. Old Father O'Day once said to dad (as he entered the front door of St. Thomas), "I'm glad to see you finally found time to make it to mass, Mr. Drugan." At that time, dad was struggling with cancer and was so sick and tired he could hardly walk. Dad, without saying a word to the priest, walked into church holding my hand and muttered, "a-hole." For months and months after that, dad would take me, alone, on Sunday mornings to church, each time to a different church. I think dad was looking for peace and looking for answers. He knew he was very sick and the catholic faith offered him little, if any comfort."

DEATH OF LENA'S HUSBAND, DAVID

David's final years were spent trying hard to conceal the physical pain and mental anguish of stomach cancer. He'd underwent an operation in Rochester, Minnesota in late 1928 that allowed him to live another five years, years that he spent in and out of hospitals and in great mental and physical pain. Martha (Drugan) Westphal indicated that he'd come home from work and literally collapse on the sofa, exhausted. "Dad would motion me to come and rub his shoulders, and I'd do so until my little hands hurt. I didn't know there was anything wrong with him, but toward the end, noticed that he wasn't eating much except soup and that he'd lost so much weight that his railroad uniform had to be taken in regularly. When I'd rub his back and shoulders, I could feel every bone in his body. It wasn't long

after that he died. Even at his funeral, I was too young to realize that he was never going to come back. Weeks passed before I really felt the sadness set in. I missed him so much it hurt. And, I don't know how, but Ma managed to be there for every one of us. I think dad's death was a lot harder on Ma and the older kids. Dad's many friends, co-workers from the railroad, were all very helpful in our time of need. Especially dad's best friend, Ori Dubois who put his whole life on hold to make sure Ma and all us kids were well taken care of. What a good man he was."

LENA AS A SINGLE PARENT

David died, at the young age of 45, on October 6th 1934 and was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery, Winona, Minnesota two days later. Lena was left to raise 7 children virtually by herself. She took jobs, often several at a time to make ends meet. She worked as a seamstress in a glove factory, worked as a cleaning woman, worked for a fur company, worked in a beauty shop, and, was one of the first "Avon Ladies" in southern Minnesota. When asked what it was like raising seven children in the depression, Lena said, "Well, you just have to do what you have to do, that's all. Just about everyone was poor and struggling. The farmers and their families were better off because they had gardens and food. But, we had to rely on the grocery store and never seemed to have enough money to make ends meet. Oh, sure, it was hard, yes. But I knew, when your grandpa got sick that I'd have to do something, so you sort of plan for the future. He was sick for a long time, so as hard as it was, there was still, at least, some time to prepare. Not like when someone dies suddenly in an accident. We went on relief too, and that was hard. People would look down on you, even at church. But I just said - to heck with them - and did what I had to do. It was difficult, I s'pose, but you never thought of that; you were just glad to have a job and happy that your kids were good kids, that's all. And, boy, that's one thing I can say - I had good kids, every one of them!

There was always someone worse off than you back then. Hobos, and bums would come to the back door asking for food or rags or a few cents. I would always have them in, at least for a cup of coffee and a piece of bread. And then have them sweep the porch or shovel snow so they felt some pride. Most were good men, just jobless and hungry. Oh, and there were the drunkards too, but they needed a cup of coffee just like anyone else. You know, Robby, I prayed a lot too and that's what kept me going. It always seemed like when we were down to our last penny, or I'd poured my last cup of coffee into a beggar's cup, something wonderful would happen the next day. A caller would come by with food, or somebody would bring a blanket by or a coat that they didn't need. We did just fine because we all stuck together. Everybody pitched in and worked, did their chores and helped me; all my kids. What a blessing. And if it weren't for your grandpa's friends from the railroad, I don't know what I would have done. Ori Dubois, who was your grandpa's best friend; oh, what a Godsend he was. And the Goodfellows, who'd bring food and warm clothes. And my dear dad and Ma and everyone else who watched over us. So I can't take all the credit because everyone pitched in. And God, well, He sure did watch over us day and night."

LENA'S SECOND HUSBAND, VINSON A. RICE

Lena met Vinson Rice in 1937, while she and her children were living at 618 W. Howard St. in Winona, close to four years after the death of her husband. Vinson, born March 5, 1904, was from Pierce County, Wisconsin, and had come to Winona to work for the Froedtert Grain & Malt Co. When asked how he met Lena, Vinson said, "I was a carpenter and working for Froedtert Malt. And I did side work too. Those were rough times, boy. I got asked by Lee's landlord to fix a leak in the roof of the house she was living in. That's when we first met. She made me coffee one day when I was done working and we got to talking. And then she forced me in to marrying her!" Although Lena's version of the story is a bit different, the two were married on the 12th of November, 1938 at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Winona. Vinson, nicknamed "Whitey" because of his light blonde hair, was previously married to Frances Jenks and had a son named Lauren who was born August 20, 1927. Lauren, at the time, was living with his grandparents on their farm in Union Township near Plum City, Wisconsin.

Vinson, a journeyman carpenter, worked on numerous large local construction projects in the Winona area over the years, including St. Anne's Hospice, St. Mary's Catholic Church and the Watkins Manor, later to become the Watkins United Methodist Home where he passed away March 4, 1982. Other notable projects that he took part in include restoration of the shipping locks at Sault Sainte Marie, Michigan, and modernization of the Alaska Highway, both government projects - just prior to and during WWII.

THE WEST END CABINS, WINONA, MN

Over the years, "Whitey" and Lena embarked on numerous business ventures including purchasing the West End Modern Cabins and Trailer Park, located at 1603 W. 5th Street in Winona in 1943. The property consisted of a

home where Whitey and Lena lived, along with a dozen or so small cabins and a trailer park. The cabins were rented either short or long term, as were onsite trailers and trailer spaces. Whitey took care of the grounds and maintained the buildings, while Lena did housekeeping and bookkeeping. In May 1955, they sold the business to John Quinlan of St. Paul, and moved to Madeline Island, just across the bay from Ashland, Wisconsin in Lake Superior.

MOVE TO MADELINE ISLAND (LAKE SUPERIOR)

They purchased a home on Madeline Island where Whitey spent the first year remodeling the kitchen and bathrooms. "I put in all new cabinets, repaired the roof, and finished the basement off. You had to go clear to Bayfield on the ferry to pickup lumber and materials and then haul it back to the island. It was a lot of back-and-forth just to get what you needed to do the job. Lee (Lena) did all the painting on the inside . It looked real good in the end," recalled Whitey. In addition to working on their own home, they had taken a position as caretakers of a large estate owned by Mr. and Mrs. T. A. Gary who only used the estate as a vacation home during the summer months. "There wasn't a lot of work to do for the Gary's. I kept the grounds mowed down, and, when guests would come, I'd fire up the furnace and show them around. Lee, well, she'd make up the beds and make sure water was running and keep the place clean inside. When we'd leave for the winter, I'd put up storm sash, turn the water off and make sure everything was locked up. The Garys were nice folks. Boy, they had real money too, but you'd never know it," said Whitey.

During the cold winter months, Whitey and Lena would leave Madeline Island and travel to warmer climates. They spent several winters in California where they stayed with Lena's daughter Martha (Drugan) Westphal and her family in San Jose, and in nearby Fremont, California.

THE HILLCREST MOTEL, ALMA, WI

After living five years on Madeline Island, Whitey and Lena sold their home to Mr. and Mrs. Gary who later turned it into a guest house. From Madeline Island, they moved back to Winona where Whitey took a job with the P. Earl Schwab Construction Company as a carpentry foreman. While in Winona, they purchased two homes that were slated for demolition near Winona State College, and had them moved to lots in Goodview, a small suburb of Winona. They remodeled both homes, sold one, and moved into the other where they lived for three years.

After selling their home in Goodview, they purchased the Hillcrest Motel in Alma, Wisconsin in 1963 and operated it until selling out and moving to Fountain City, Wisconsin in 1968. The Motel was situated on the side of a bluff overlooking the Mississippi River. During the summer months, they rarely had a vacancy, and during the winter, ice fisherman and snowmobilers kept the vacancy rate down to a minimum. As the motel became too much work for them to keep up with, they decided to sell out and retire, purchasing a home in Fountain City several months after the sale.

FINAL DAYS

After several more moves within the local area (Fountain City and Cochrane, WI), they returned to Winona and moved into a high rise retirement apartment where they lived until they could no longer care for themselves. They relocated to a nursing home in La Crescent, Minnesota where their health declined rapidly. At this time, Martha (Drugan) Westphal and her family relocated to Winona from California to care for Whitey and Lena, spending three years there looking after their needs. Lena contracted pneumonia and passed away at Lutheran Hospital in La Crosse, Wisconsin on March 1, 1980, just hours after a visit from her daughter Martha and grandson Robert Westphal, Jr.

After Lena's death, David Drugan, Jr. and his sister Martha (Drugan) Westphal decided to relocate Whitey to Winona so he would be closer to his family. He was moved into the Watkins United Methodist Home, Winona, where he remained until his death, March 4, 1982.

Whitey and Lena were a very social and civic minded couple. Even in their golden years, they were active in civic affairs and many local clubs and societies. Both belonged to the Eagle's Club, where Lena was president of the auxiliary for many years. Whitey was president, for several terms, of the West End Commercial Club, an organization that promoted local business and trade, as well as a key member of several regional tourist councils and sports clubs. Both were avid bowlers, traveled frequently, were valued members of the Lutheran Church, and had many, many close friends.

Assuming the role of stepfather of seven children during terrible economic times was far from being an easy role for Whitey, but through his dedication, loyalty and tireless effort, he came to be a valued and loved member of our family. Both Lena and Whitey were dynamic people; a dynamic couple, who left a legacy of 27 grandchildren and 19 great -grandchildren. The good memories they have left us with will live forever in our hearts.

Harry L. Hanson, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hanson of Baraboo and a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. Vinson Rice, 253 Olmstead Street, has been cited by military authorities for gallantry at Pearl Harbor on December 7 and also has been advanced in rank, it was learned today.

The surprise attack of the Japanese paralyzed radio communication because the antenna on the administration building had been shot down. The citation states young Hanson mounted the building under fire and other danger and restored the antenna, and as a result communication for the air forces was resumed. The Baraboo boy further kept the radio communication functioning throughout the fight, the citation says.

Descendants of Andrew Drugan General Notes: Was Harry's birth year in 1890 or 1891? We may never know for sure as there seems to be no definitive birth record. His gravestone indicates 1890 but always remember that such monuments are created by others after the death of the person and therefore are subject to only what the survivors thought to be the correct birth year. The 1900 Census also indicates a specific birth year of 1890 supposedly as given by Harry. The 1905 and 1910 census records are not specific and his age given on those documents would support a birth year of either 1890 or 1891. Somehow Harry managed to avoid the 1920 and 1930 Census or else his name is indexed in a grossly misspelled manner. Around 1920 was when he moved from Trempealeau, WI to Winona, MN so he could be enumerated in either location but the 1930 US Census should show him as living in Winona, MN yet his name has not yet been located. His Draft Registration card that he signed in 1917 indicates a birth year of 1891. His obituary erroneously indicated a birth year of 1893. Oral Record from Martha Drugan-Westphal, Mar 2003: "I was doing a puzzle with uncle Harry when he got sick and got taken to hospital. He had a bleeding ulcer for quite some time. Uncle Harry looked like your uncle David (David Drugan, Jr.) only a little shorter. Aunt Sallie was pretty." Earl W. 

Some researchers try to show that Mary Drugan married Timothy McDermott in Chicago on 2 Dec 1889. However, there is no proof that the Mary Drugan shown on the marriage license was the same Mary Drugan, daughter of Peter and Ellen Drugan. The 1889 marriage application does not show her birth location nor does it show the names of her parents. In fact, it provides her age as 22 which is an approximate birth year of 1867. That is eleven years prior to the known birth year of 1878 in Wisconsin. It is very unlikely that these are the same person. The only thing positive about this connection is that there was a family of McDermotts that were living in nearby Whitehall, Trempealeau County, Wisconsin with one son named Timothy. But he was born in 1879 which means he would have been only 10 years old when he was married in Chicago.

There is a 1920 US Census record from Chicago which may or may not be the same couple from the marriage record, Timothy and Mary McDermott but the wife's name appears as Margaret born about 1872 in Canada.

Another confusing record is a 1900 US Census record from Chicago which shows a widowed Mary McDermott with 2 children both of whom were born in Nebraska. This Mary shows that she was born in Wisconsin and both of her parents were born in Ireland. This data would seem to match that of Mary Drugan, daughter of Peter and Ellen Drugan. However, her birth date was provided on the census record as Apr 1848 which makes her 30 years too old for the correct Mary Drugan and almost 20 years older than the Mary Drugan shown on the 1889 marriage record.

All of this provides proof that there were several Drugan families living near the Chicago region and just because one was named Mary does not automatically make it the correct Mary Drugan.

The gravestone is somewhat confusing. The Catherine LaVigne that is buried alongside Aurilla was an older aunt (sister of her mother, Adeline Marie LaVigne). Aurilla and her aunt are buried together because of a very close relationship during their lives. Catherine never married and she lived with Leo and Aurilla beginning in 1920 when they lived in La Crosse, WI and moved with them in 1926 to Florida where she continued to live with them until 1939. At that time, they all returned to Trempealeau where Catherine was living with her uncle, William Perkins, in Trempealeau during the 1940 US Census. Within just a few years, Leo and Aurilla returned to Florida, probably for health reasons. They had been moving to Florida during the harsh winters for a number of years.

When Leo died in 1942, he was buried in the Bay Pines National Cemetery in Bay Pines, Florida because of his military service in the Navy. Aurilla returned back to Trempealeau and lived together with her beloved aunt for 9 more years until Catherine died in 1951. When Aurilla died 19 years later in 1980, she chose to be buried next to her aunt in Trempealeau instead of near her husband in Florida.





Frank Plate, Frank Plait were aka's for Frank Placheski who had an extensive criminal record as a juvenile and young adult, with charges ranging from public intoxication to burglary and child molestation. He served multiple jail terms, and was sentenced to prison in Sherburne, MN and later in Stillwater, MN. His entire life was spent in and out of reformatories, jail and prison. Winona, MN newspaper articles involving Frank's criminal activity are plentiful. The only period that his criminal activity seemed to stop was for a brief time just after his marriage to Edith Shrake, when most of his exploits only involved automobile and intoxication violations. It is difficult to imagine how Edith Shrake saw fit to marry this man, given his police record. After 1940, the couple either divorced or separated, and Edith relocated to Beloit, WI, while Frank remained largely in the Winona area.

STORE WINDOW IS SMASHED; RIFLE IS STOLEN

Police today were seeking to trace the person or persons who last night smashed one of the front display windows at the hardware store of the R. D. Cone Co., 64 E. Second Street, and escaped with a .32 caliber used Winchester repeating rifle.

The thief apparently reached for several other guns in the window, but knocked them down in an effort to obtain a grip on them, police said. A large stone was used to break the window.

The theft occurred just two months after a similar incident, when two guns and two hunting knives were taken. Frank Plate, 18 years old, was arrested by police in connection with that theft, pleaded guilty, and is now in county jail awaiting sentence.

Frank Plate, 22 year old Winona youth, brought back from Milwaukee Saturday to face a charge of burglary, today

asked for a preliminary hearing when he was arraigned in municipal court and is being held in the county jail in default of \$2,000 bail.

Plate was released from the state reformatory on parole last October when he was serving a term of not more than five years on a charge of burglary. He also served two terms in the training school for boys at Red Wing.

The latest offense with which the youth is charged took place on Feb. 12, according to Chief of Police H. C. Riebau, when he is alleged to have robbed an apartment at 205 E. Sanborn Street in the company of Clarence Bambenek who already has been apprehended and returned to the state reformatory to serve the remainder of a term from which he also was paroled.

Plate was sought on Feb. 13 but escaped from police when he told them he was going to get his coat. He was later traced to Milwaukee where he was arrested last week in a small store operated by his sister. Deputy Sheriff August Sielaff returned him here Saturday night.

After escaping from police here, he ran out of a rear door of the Winona paper box factory where he was working. Plate said that he slept the first night in the willows along the riverbank in the east end of the city. The second night, after going without food all day, he slept behind a boat house and on the third night he stayed under a barn, he told police.

Because of the intense cold he awoke every few minutes and had to move to keep from freezing to death, he said. After spending more than a week in this fashion, Plate said that he bummed a ride on a Milwaukee train for the Wisconsin city. He said that he did not go back to his home and always hid when he saw anyone until after he left Winona.

Bambenek confessed to his part in the robbery before he was returned to St. Cloud, Chief Riebau said. At the same time, he involved Plate. The apartment was occupied by Mrs. Kathryn Sibley at the time of the robbery. Plate still has two and a half years of his previous sentences to serve but police said that the new charge will be pressed against him.

The preliminary examination was set for Tuesday, March 20, at 9 a.m.

SOUTHERNER JUMBO (1954)

The Southerner Jumbo, an old substitute in the Gibson line, was during many years the retort to 'acorazadó of Martin. This guitar is of 1954 and has pretty finished a totally original one. As he is typical in the Gibson acoustic, its rich and ligneous tone is appropriate for the technique of "finger picking" or "strumming", is the guitar of the recording of "Who's Your Baby" and also she is the one that I use for that subject during the tour. Also I am called on with this and style "to finger picked" the "Prairie Wedding", although in the recording of the disc I used a Martin D-21 of 1965.

GRETSCH ARCH TOP GUITAR (mid-1930's)

"Certainly the senior guitar on tour, I purchased this instrument in 1969 while living in Los Angeles. It belonged to a wonderful guitar player and friend of mine, **Seymour Drugan**, who played in the 1930s and 40s as a staff guitarist on radio in Chicago. He purchased this guitar new, in fact he purchased 2 of them at the same time and called one the male and the other the female because of their very different tones. "**Drugan**" is inlaid across the top banner of the head stock where it used to say Gretsch. Seymour moved to L. A. in the 1950's and worked for many years in the instrument department of Wallich's Music City on the famous corner of Sunset and Vine. In 1968 he came to work at Al Casey's music store where I too was employed. He was a constant source of good advice to me, and was well known and loved by all the West Coast guitar players. After his death in 1969 I purchased this guitar from his wife. By the way, mine is the female and it's mate, the male, is enjoying semi-retirement in Phoenix, Arizona with Al Casey. A woman's work is never done, and this female stays busy, she's the "Rudiger" guitar on record and tour."

LUTHER NALLIE ON JOHNNY WINTER: TG (Tom Guerra) Talks to Johnny Winter's Guitar Teacher - Luther Nallie of the Sons of the Pioneers, arguably America's oldest group, around in one form or another since 1933.

TG: So Luther, Johnny mentioned that you were a big influence on him as a guitarist and a teacher that set him on his way. Was teaching your main gig back then?

LN: Yes, it was. I was also doing some club dates off and on, but teaching was my living. I did teach Johnny and Edgar both, Johnny more than Edgar. I remember this kid coming in who had previously taken from **Seymour Drugan**, a fine guitarist who had played on the "Breakfast Club" on one of the major radio networks. Johnny had me scratching my head a lot of times because he would soak up anything I taught him immediately, and I would have to think up something else real quick to show him. He was a very normal boy and very polite and extremely talented. It was always a pleasure when it was time for Johnny's lesson or if he just happened to come by to visit. I taught Johnny for about a year I think, and this was in 1956 in Beaumont at Jefferson Music Company.

Johnny Winter

By Don Menn - From Guitar Player, August 1974

Beginning with his great grandmother's hundred- year old Spanish guitar with a neck "all horribly warped like a bow," Johnny Winter -- the Texas blues rocker -- has been stringing guitars since he was eleven. He's worked his way through the years with first a Gibson ES-125, then a white Stratocaster, a couple of Gibson Les Paul customs (one gold, one white), and a '66 Fender Mustang.

With allowance money earned by grass mowing and lugging out garbage, Beaumont, Texas' best-known guitarist began accumulating his giant record collection of rock and roll (Carl Perkins, Elvis Presley, Little Richard, Fats Domino, etc.), post-war Chicago blues (Muddy Waters, Howlin' Wolf, Otis Rush, Sonny Boy Williamson, etc.), and later the blues of the Mississippi Delta, of Louisiana, and Texas. "Lightnin' Slim and Lonesome Sundown and Lazy Lester; I mixed all that stuff up," Winter recalls. "A lot of it was still on 78s, but on the backs of albums by people like Muddy Waters I 'd read about Robert Johnson, and Son House, and Leadbelly, and Blind Lemon. When their albums finally did come out, I'd remember their names and buy them, buy the Delta blues."

Was Clarence Garlow your only teacher?

No, there were several guys. I never took lessons like to learn how to read music or where to put my fingers. I would just ask these guys to show me whatever they thought I ought to know. The guy who really started me off was a guy named Luther Naley, a really good country guitar player. The last time I talked to him he was playing bass with Roy Rogers [laughs]. Luther was working at Jefferson Music Company in Beaumont. I guess he thought I was good, and we got to be really good friends. I really dug finger style -- Merle Travis/Chet Atkins things. I still love those guys. Chet Atkins is a fantastic guitar player. I just got off on a completely different game. Country and western was all around, and Luther played real good country and western. He'd show me things like "Honky-Tonk." He'd really go to a lot of trouble. If I'd ask him to show something to me he didn't know, he'd go and get the record, and figure it out and come back and show me. When I got interested in blues, Luther really didn't know too much at all about that, so I picked that up a lot on records. I knew enough to go on from there by myself. I could listen to the record and learn the licks myself. For a while there was another guy, Seymore Drugan, that played in gig bands, and in the old days he worked for Rickenbacker for a while. He was kind of a jazz guitar player. I took two or three lessons from him and learned some chords and different things. I didn't want to get into jazz, but I thought it would be cool to learn some of the things that he could show me. His son, Dennis, ended up being my bass player in my first rock and roll band, Johnny and the Jammers [laughs].

Dear Patricia,

Thank you so much for writing back, even after a time. I fully understand the vagaries of email, the web, and uncommon sites.

If you have a way of reaching any of Mr. Drugan's children assuming he had kids, I would love to share this with them, too. You may feel free to simply forward it to them, with the request that if they so desire they should write me. I'd love to let them know just what a great man their dad was.

I used to take the bus into Hollywood, to Wallach's Music City at Sunset and Vine, practically every chance I could. There was an old guy there named Seymour Drugan, who was probably younger than I am now, but seemed pretty old at the time I was maybe 11 or 12. After a while he got pretty used to my hanging around and would talk to me a little. I was on the verge, and perhaps past the verge, of getting into a lot of trouble by then, and Mr. Drugan helped pick out an electric guitar for me to rent, for a mighty \$7.50 a month. After three months of playing this gold-topped Les Paul he offered to sell it to me for the balance of \$77.50. (The value of that 53 Les Paul today is approximately 50,000, but then I wanted a Stratocaster!) Only many years later did I realize that he had picked out the best guitar in the store, rented it to me for practically nothing, and then offered it to me at a steal as a favor.

After a while Mr. Drugan got to trust that I would be respectful (even though I was generally a fairly disrespectful person other places), and he trusted me to get guitars down to show customers if he was busy. Later, when Craig started working there, Mr. Drugan must have told him it was ok, because he started asking me to get a guitar also. Craig occasionally showed me stuff on guitar. I knew that Mr. Drugan had been a relatively well-known musician, and a respected one, because he was listed in the Gibson catalogue as a Gibson player. I already liked and respected him, but this added to his mystique for me, as an impressionable kid.

One morning, a Sunday as I recall, Mr. Drugan called me at home to ask if I'd come in to the store. Of course, I hopped on a bus and got there as quickly as I could. He took me into a small cubicle off the main guitar area and took a big jazz guitar out of an old case. I sat down and he played jazz standards for me for about half an hour, without saying a word. I was in a weird state of mind, half feeling the honor of his playing for me and half bored. Remember, I was a 13 year old kid who was into surf music and rock and roll; jazz meant nothing to me at that time. However, one thing about all this was clear to me, even if only on a very subconscious level: he was telling me that music was a life. He was letting me in on the fact that you don't have to outgrow music, and that guitars were also a life. On that internal level I knew that this was something very special and that I was being honored and respected, and that he cared about me. He had taken the trouble to call me and to

share this time and music with me. He knew I was really into guitars, and he was telling me that it was ok.

After playing for me for a while, Mr. Drugan put the guitar away and said that he had really called because he wanted me to help him with some thing. We went back into the shop area and I helped him unpack the first Gibson Firebirds in Los Angeles. The first Gibson Firebirds! He certainly didn't need my help; he sure made my day. I got it.

Any time a big name artist came into the store, and this was Sunset and Vine, he would introduce me as if I mattered. I met Carol Kaye, the Association (he asked me to see if I could find them something unusual to use on their next record!), Barney Kessel, and many others. Later, when I was in the lowest time of my life, in Biloxi, Mississippi, he sent me my guitar, carefully packed up and ready to play. A friend of mine was in a plane crash and badly injured, to the point he could hardly move his arms or legs. Mr. Drugan had Milt Owen, the upstairs guitar repairer, build a mini guitar for my friend to play in the hospital during his long recovery.

The store sold, the new guy was simply not the man Drugan was and I stopped going in to the shop. I heard later that Mr. Drugan was working in a hole-in-the-wall music store on a side street, so I went in to see him, but he had just left. I never saw him again. I never knew what had happened to him, or that he had died so very young, and to a far too great a degree, unsung.

Because of Mr. Drugan I feel a lifelong debt, which I can only repay by helping kids that either come to me, or are referred by teachers or advisors. I've almost always had some boy or girl that I trade help on their guitar or bass for helping me clean up my shop. Sometimes they don't work out, sometimes they stay on for years, overlapping with another kid who is in need of a guitar mentor. I am working now with a young man who was dropping out of school and vandalizing and who was nearly shot one night for being in the wrong place at the wrong time. His advisor persisted in calling me to meet with him and finally I had a chance to get together with him. I've been teaching him for a couple of years now. He is attending the J. C. and I just gave him a scholarship to a class in lutherie I was teaching. I really like him and he has really turned himself around.

My dream is to keep collecting wood and eventually have a small lutherie scholarship in Mr. Drugan's name. I would provide wood (a diminishing resource) and guidance to a young enthusiastic wannabe luthier, chosen through the Guild of American Luthiers. I would like to be able to pass on both knowledge and the honor that Mr. Drugan gave me, as a kid who was on the verge of a lot of trouble.

I hope this rather long story has given you some more insight into Seymour Drugan and just what a hero he really was. One of the biggest disappointments in my life has been that I never had a chance to show him my work, the work he probably made possible by being there for me when I needed someone. I wish I could have showed him that I understood, and that I truly appreciated what he had done.

The next best thing would be for his family to know about him and to see the work I've done in his honor.

General Notes:

This story was told to me in June of 2001 by Margaret's brother, David Drugan when I visited him in Winona, Minnesota. It was well known that Margaret never learned to drive a car through her entire life but there was one time in the 1930's when she was around 19 years old and all the kids were all just hanging around the front porch on one summer evening. One of Margaret's boyfriends by the name of Bucky Bones came by to show off his car. Somehow Margaret convinced him to let her drive his car for a short test drive around the neighborhood and they both took off saying that they'd be right back. None of her brother or sisters believed that she'd ever be able to drive but a few minutes later they all couldn't believe it when the car came flying down the residential street at a very high rate of speed with Margaret behind the wheel.

Margaret Drugan grew up in Winona, Minnesota and had a boyfriend with the name of Bucky Bones. Around 1939 she met Franklin Lightfoot. The rumor is that Franklin was still married at the time but Margaret moved to Chicago with him while his divorce became final. Margaret apparently met the first wife and when the divorce became official, the first wife literally danced in the street.

There is no definitive evidence but it is believed that Margaret and Franklin were married in Chicago in late 1939 or early 1940. Around 1958 or 1959, they separated and Margaret moved to Springfield along with Brian. Franklin, Jr. was attending Winona State College in Winona, Minnesota and Lee was in California working with his uncle, Robert Westphal.

At first, Margaret and Brian lived with her sister, Ruth Drugan Gilpin, for several months in a mobile home on their property. When Margaret was financially enough capable, she rented a 3rd floor apartment at 427 West Jefferson Street in Springfield, Illinois owned by "Mr. Rockwell". Margaret worked in the hosiery department of Myers Brothers department store in downtown Springfield.

Around 1960, Margaret had applied for and received a job with the State of Illinois, Department of Unemployment Compensation in Rockford, Illinois. Margaret, Brian and Lee who had returned from California, moved to Rockford with Lee driving a 1957 Plymouth. At first they lived in a second floor "studio" apartment, 105 Forest Avenue, along West State Street near the Martin Oil gas station. By this time, Lee was drafted into the Army. Margaret met William E. Mitchell who also worked at the State Unemployment Office and they married August 13, 1962.

Margaret and Bill met in the Unemployment Compensation office in Rockford where they both worked. Both were very poor and Brian was still living with his mother, Margaret, and attending school in Rockford, They eventually married, probably to pool their resources and save on rent expenses. Their first home was on West State Street in Rockford about the "Honey Boy Pizza Bakery" believed to be about the 1500 block. That entire area was torn down in the 1990s. They later moved farther out on West State Street to about the 2100 block in the second floor of a larger house. Later, Margaret quit her work probably due to the oncoming illness of amyloidosis. Bill was promoted to Deputy Claims Examiner of the Freeport Unemployment office and he commuted the 30 miles every day. They later moved to a second floor apartment at 1331 Evelyn Street just off Auburn Street in Rockford. By that time, Brian was out of school and married a few years later. Bill was given a promotion to the Office Manager of the Quincy Illinois Unemployment Office and they moved there and bought a house.

Margaret was continuing with her illness and eventually diagnosed at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester as amyloidosis. She took some experimental medicine for a number of years with the side effect that she swelled up and looked all bloated. It also gave her breath an extreme garlic smell. After Margaret died in 1971, Bill continued to work at the Quincy office until his retirement. His eyesight declined over the years and he was nearly blind when he died. He loved to drink beer and watch the Saint Louis Cardinals baseball team.





Marriage Notes:

Recent records were discovered in 2022 that indicate a marriage between Frank L. Lightfoot and Margaret Drugan on 8 Dec 1941 in Saint Louis, Missouri. This was just over one year after the birth of their first son, Franklin Jr. in Chicago, Illinois. They were first living together in Chicago so it is not known why they traveled to Saint Louis to get married.

Around 1958 or 1959, they separated and Margaret moved to Springfield, Illinois along with her two of her sons, Lee and Brian. Franklin, Jr. was attending Winona State College in Winona, Minnesota.

Prior to the discovery, the initial research explored these concepts and records. As a youngster, I can remember Mom mentioning several times that theirs was a "common law" marriage. Whether or not common law marriages were legal at the time is somewhat moot at this point especially considering the discovery of the marriage record in Saint Louis. In nearly all states, common law marriages are no longer valid. After several months of searching for records in Illinois, Wisconsin, and Minnesota, I am unable to come up with any documents showing that they were ever legally married. I believe that Frank and Margaret starting living together in Chicago while he was still technically married to his previous wife. After a few weeks or months, when this divorce happened, is when we hear about Margaret saying that the previous wife literally danced in the street. I suspect that Frank just put off the concept of getting married again or was too busy doing whatever he was doing, or just didn't want to get tied up in any more official ceremonies. I also think there is a chance that he may have had some police warrants out for him at the time and therefore he wasn't about to apply for any official license where his name could come up on a police blotter.

There still is a chance that they did officially get married but I have not yet asked the appropriate source for that record. The state of Illinois seems to be the worst for tracking marriage records in that there is no central statewide database. The counties in and around Chicago seemed to be able to keep their own records without any statewide notification. So unless I ask each and every county in Illinois, I may never know for sure. To the best of all of the relatives knowledge, they all assume that they were married in Chicago, Cook County, Illinois. In typical Cook County tradition, after a payment of fees for obtaining a copy of a marriage record between Drugan and Lightfoot, I was given a response six weeks later that no such record exists and a thank you for the payment of the fees which was non-refundable.

In somewhat of a support of the notion that they were never officially married is the 1940 US Census conducted in April in Cook County which shows Margaret Drugan living in an apartment at 941 Agatite Street. She was 23 years old and working as a waitress. Her marital status was marked as single. She would have been about 4 months pregnant at the time with Franklin Jr.

A copy of the divorce decree between Margaret and Frank was filed by Frank in 1962 in Volusia County, Florida which shows that he provided a marriage date of 10 December 1940 in Saint Louis, Missouri. On the copy provided to Margaret, she scratched off that date and wrote in 10 September 1939 in Chicago, Cook County, Illinois but Cook County claims that they have no record of such a marriage.

Robert Westphal Jr. adds a story that his mom went (from Winona) and lived with Frank and Margaret on Hoyne Avenue in Chicago sometime in late 1942. Mom said they lived in an upstairs apartment (above a billiards hall) and she slept on the Davenport (not to be confused with the city in Iowa), and worked at Montgomery Wards, downtown Chicago, in the accounting office. She said that Frank would disappear for days on end, and Margaret would throw all of his clothes out onto the fire escape (madder than hell!) Shortly thereafter, she got a civil service job (ration board) at the Hercules Powder Works (Ammo Plant) in Baraboo, Wisconsin, met Robert Westphal, Sr., and the rest is history.





General Notes:

His first name was spelled either Franklin or Franklyn but according to a 1924 high school yearbook from Eau Claire, he apparently used "Franklin".

His birth certificate was issued without any given name and it is doubtful if the parents ever filed an amended certificate once they decided on a name. During his adult life he generally used the name of "Frank" or sometimes

"Franklyn". Almost all of his Naval records from 1926-1929 show the name spelled as "Franklyn". There are copies of hand-written letters from his parents showing the name spelled as "Franklyn".

Franklin was his parents' first son born in Eau Claire, Wisconsin in 1907 during a time in which the lumbering and saw mill operations were the only sustainable industry in town. There have been many family stories about his wild youthful years but little faith can be put into most of them because of the nature in which Frank often embellished many stories. One family story says that he left school sometime in the 9th or 10th grade but this is proved false because of the 1924 Eau Claire High School yearbook showing him still enrolled in high school at the age of 16 or 17 probably his Junior year or 11th grade.

Another story that apparently has some basis in fact is that he apparently enlisted in the army when he was only 14 or 15 years old. There is a photograph of him taken in an Army uniform presumably from Fort Snelling, Minnesota where he first enlisted and completed his Army basic training. This would have been taken in 1922 or 1923.

While stationed at Fort Snelling, he and another friend supposedly left their guard duty posts and went AWOL, and hopped a freight train heading west. They both were caught by the Railroad Police in Salt Lake City and supposedly sent to Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. The Fort Leavenworth part of the story was a stretch of the truth because Army records show that he was confined to Fort Douglas, Utah and not Fort Leavenworth. Fort Douglas was a very small Army garrison stationed about 3 miles east of Salt Lake City.

When the Army found out that he was only 15 years old and under their minimum required age, they discharged him and sent him back home. There are some stories that Frank told the Army officers that they couldn't hold him because he was only 15 years old and under the minimum age. This was true and Frank was given an Honorable Discharge from the US Army "by reason of minority" on 15 Oct 1923. The discharge papers were signed by the Prison Officer, Major L. B. Bennett. Upon his return home from the army, he was back in high school where he appears in a 1924 class picture.

There is little else known about his early years after high school but he apparently ran away from or left home at an early age where he spent most of the time in the Chicago area. It is known that he spent a lot of time returning to Eau Claire and Cornell, Wisconsin to visit his favorite grandfather, William Lightfoot, until he died in 1930. For a number of years prior to around 1925, William Lightfoot lived separately from his wife, Loretta Lightfoot, also in Eau Claire, due to William's excessive abuse of alcohol. Frank's uncle Harry Lightfoot was living in Chicago and it is thought that Franklyn may have also spent a lot of time there but not wanting his parents to know of his whereabouts.

Surprisingly his parents allowed him to enlist in the Navy where he served for a period of just over 2 years from November of 1926 to January of 1929 when he was dishonorably discharged, supposedly for being intoxicated and physically assaulting a superior officer. This puts his age between 19 and 22 at the time of that event which suggest that not long after falsely enlisting in the army, he enlisted in the Navy but this time he apparently was over the legitimate age of 18. The Navy records are not detailed enough to indicate the reason for his discharge other than the notation "Bad Conduct Discharge". But there are multiple records of Frank's being declared a "straggler" after missing the boat when it would leave dock.

His youngest sister, Jean, remembers him returning home in Eau Claire in 1929 when she was only 4 years old and it was the first time she had ever seen her brother when he knocked on their front door. Apparently the parents also had not heard from him for a number of years so they were overwhelmed to see him return home at that time.

After his time in the Navy, Frank's dad, Lee Lightfoot, attempted to put Frank to work in the saw mills in Eau Claire but apparently Frank did not like that life style and after a bitter argument, he soon left home bound once again for the streets of Chicago.

Not much else is known of his activities in the years between 1929 and 1939. There are some unsubstantiated family rumors that during those years, he may have been involved in a number of petty crimes in and around Chicago including one rumor that he was arrested by the FBI and charged with running a "white slavery" racket. Other rumors include counterfeiting operations, and passing off zircons as diamonds to unsuspecting jewelers. All charges of which were eventually quelled due to the influence of some federal judges to which his parents had made some substantial

financial gifts and the FBI prosecutions were eventually dismissed.

It is believed that during the period of 1929 to 1939, Frank was first married to a woman believed to be named Connie Sonsalla, a family name that was quite extensive known around the Trempealeau, Wisconsin area. Her actual surname may have be Consalla or Sonsalla and it is not known for sure if she was from the Trempealeau, Wisconsin and Winona, Minnesota areas, the Eau Claire, Wisconsin area, or from the Chicago, Illinois area. It is not known just how long this first marriage lasted but they eventually divorced and Frank then married another woman that we know only as "Ada". Frank often jokingly referred to her as "Ada Potato". Their divorce became final in 1939 just soon after he met Margaret Drugan in Winona, Minnesota in late 1939. Margaret Drugan left the Winona area and had gone to Chicago to be with Frank. The story goes that when Ada received the news of her final decree of divorce, she literally "danced in the street". It is believed that no children resulted from the marriage with either Ada or Connie Sonsalla.

During the years from 1940s to the 1970s, he spent lengthy times traveling the roadways as part of his home insulation and stained glass window repair business and he made frequent stops back in Eau Claire, Wisconsin to meet his parents and visit his grandmother, Loretta Lightfoot, who was living in a Veteran's care facility in King, Wisconsin until she died in 1946. Another favorite stopping off point for him was Baldy's Bar in Eau Claire where he met many of his younger friends. After his parents retired and moved to Davenport, Iowa, Frank continued to make repeated visits to them at that location, something that was surprising given his earlier years of strained relationships with his parents.

He was divorced from Margaret Drugan in 1962 after he met Ann Scarf in Wheeling, West Virginia and began a tumultuous affair with her. At the time of the divorce from Margaret, Frank and Ann were living in Ormond Beach, Florida while Margaret and the children had just relocated from Baltimore, Maryland to Chicago, Illinois and then with her sister Ruth Gilpin in Springfield, Illinois. Frank and Ann continued to run his stained-glass window repair business out of Evansville, Indiana until they eventually divorced. Frank then was remarried to another Ann, known only as "Little Ann" and they also were divorced.

During Frank's later years from the 1980s-1990s, he was pretty much retired and spent much time traveling to Florida for several months followed by a "resting and recuperation period" at the home of his son, Lee Lightfoot, in Rocklin, California. He died in 1991 in nearby Roseville, California and was cremated with his ashes being spread over the Pacific Ocean as per his wishes.

Frank was married 5 times and divorced 5 times.

Frank had other aliases that he used at various times, usually to avoid bill collectors. He confused most of them by switching his name from Frank, Franklin, Franklyn, and Lee. He also used the name Frank LaMont.

Frank had a habit of buying automobiles but never paying for them. This was before the day of computers and a nationwide credit system so most automobile dealers tended to carry their own credit accounts or would sell the transaction to a local finance company that would charge a very high rate of interest. None of that bothered Frank because he would walk into a dealership waving five hundred dollars or so in cash. Any dealer was glad to sell him a new car with that large of a cash down payment and they would finance the rest through the local loan company, sometimes conveniently owned by their brother or cousin. Unfortunately that would be the last of any money that they would ever see from Frank as he was handed the keys and the finance papers and drove off. His business of doing stained glass repairs all over the country would mean that the bank or loan company could never find the car. He would literally drive the wheels off of the car and eventually leave it on the side of the road for the repossesors to eventually find it. He would then walk back into another dealership and start the same process all over again.

Frank was never enumerated in the 1930 or 1940 census. He supposedly was living with or married to Margaret Drugan in 1940 in Chicago but only her name appears in the census and she was listed as "single". And since she was unemployed at the time according to the census and 4 months pregnant with Frank Jr., I wonder how she supported herself and paid the rent where she was living. I suspect that Frank was indeed living there with her but just avoided the census as a matter of personal preference.

Frank was married to Anne Scharf on 30 Mar 1962 in Putnam County, Florida. Unfortunately, he was not divorced from Margaret Drugan until April 1962 in Flagler County, Florida.







Margaret next married **William Eugene Mitchell**, son of **Richard Mitchell** and **Bessie M. Parker**. William was born on 19 September 1915 in Sandusky, Alexander, Illinois, United States, ²⁹⁴ died on 7 July 1994 in Quincy, Adams, Illinois, United States, ²⁹⁴ at age 78, and was buried after 7 July 1994 in Greenmount Cemetery, Quincy, Adams, Illinois, United States. ²⁹⁵ The cause of his death was Failing eyesight, High Blood Pressure, Heart disease. ²⁹⁵ They had no children. ²⁹⁵

Marriage Notes:

Following her divorce from Franklin Lightfoot, Margaret and her son, Brian, first lived with her sister, Ruth Drugan Gilpin, for several months in a mobile home on their property in Springfield, Illinois. When Margaret was financially enough capable, she rented a 3rd floor apartment at 427 West Jefferson Street in Springfield owned by "Mr. Rockwell". Margaret worked in the hosiery department of Myers Brothers department store in downtown Springfield.

Around 1960, Margaret had applied for and received a job with the State of Illinois, Department of Unemployment Compensation in Rockford, Illinois. Margaret, Brian and Lee who had returned from working in California, moved to Rockford with Lee driving a 1957 Plymouth and a U-Haul trailer. At first they lived in a second floor "studio" apartment, 105 Forest Avenue, at the corner of West State Street near the Martin Oil gas station. By this time, Lee was drafted into the Army and Margaret eventually met and married William E. Mitchell who also worked at the State Unemployment Office.

Margaret and William met in the Unemployment Compensation office in Rockford where they both worked. Both were very poor and Brian was still living with his mother, Margaret, and attending school in Rockford. They were married at the county court house on August 13, 1962 probably to pool their resources and save on rent expenses. Their wedding announcement was a blank piece of paper upon which Margaret used a typewriter to enter their names and dates on the fold-out note. She saved a copy in an envelope upon which she wrote "Bill and my wedding announcement 1962 (Well, we were poor)."

Their first home was a rented apartment in Rockford above the "Honey Boy Pizza Bakery" at 1532 West State Street. That entire area was torn down in the 1990s for community redevelopment. They later moved farther out to 2115 West State Street in the second floor of a larger house.

After a few more years, they moved into a new two story apartment building at 718 North Court Street in Rockford in which they were the building managers. Margaret had quit her work with the Unemployment Compensation office probably due to the oncoming illness of amyloidosis and her duties at the apartment building were mostly clerical, collection of rent, and assistance in the rental of vacant units. Bill was promoted to Deputy Claims Examiner of the Freeport Unemployment office and he commuted the 30 miles every day. They later moved to a second floor apartment at 1331 Evelyn Street just off Auburn Street in Rockford. By that time, Brian was out of school and was married a few years later leaving just Bill and Margaret by themselves.

Bill was given a promotion to the Office Manager of the Quincy, Illinois Unemployment Office and they moved there and bought a house at 1507 Jackson Street in Quincy. It was the first time in the lives of either one that they owned their house and Margaret was so happy about that as well as the fact that she no longer had to live on the 2nd or 3rd floor. Margaret was continuing with her illness and eventually diagnosed at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota. She took some experimental medicine from Mayo's for a number of years with the side effect that she swelled up and looked all bloated. It also gave her breath an extreme garlic smell.

After Margaret died in 1975, Bill continued to work at the Quincy office until his retirement. His eyesight declined over the years and was nearly blind when he died in 1994. His favorite pastime was to drink beer and watch the Saint

The first record is for an infant daughter, Betty Jean Mitchell, who apparently died shortly after birth. The next two records are for the mother, Virginia Temple Cook, who died at childbirth. The third record reflects that child, Carol Joyce Mitchell, who died approximately 6 months later.

Mom's Legacy

majority of our childhood years in the suburb of Pleasanton, where mom worked as a school librarian and substitute school teacher.

If ever two people were meant to be married to one another, it was mom and dad. Whether by design, or simply by being with one another for 64 years, they were inseparable. Their minds were always in synch... what one was thinking, the other was thinking too. They ALWAYS treated one another with the greatest respect, and, even when they disagreed, they never let the sun go down on problems at hand. They never held grudges. They were two people that truly lived up to being members of the "Great Generation." Despite their often hectic lives, they always took time to spend Friday nights together on "dates." When dad would come home from work, mom would always have dinner ready. But, before eating, they'd always chase us kids out of the kitchen, where they'd talk about the events of the day. Kim reminded her of our aunt Terrie, who mom always held in such high esteem. She felt at ease with Kim, and was always quick to remind everyone in the family how lucky we were to have her.

Donna

My wife, Donna, was mom's source of excitement - her biggest cheerleader. Donna was a constant source of optimism, and offered mom the motivation and encouragement she needed in her later years. Where Kim was mom's confidant, Donna was mom's source of brightness and laughter. She always said of Donna, "She's always SO upbeat and happy. She comes into the house like a whirlwind, and whenever she leaves, I'm smiling for hours." She often said that if she'd met Donna in her childhood years, they would have been best friends. Donna had a unique way of taking mom's mind off of problems or

challenges. A lot of who Donna is as a wife, mother, and grandmother, comes from mom's shining example. Donna always got along so well with my dad, and could handle him like no one else could... something mom was always in awe of.

Her first grandchild was my daughter Kellie. You would think mom won the lottery the day Kellie arrived! Mom always noted how beautiful, smart and artistic Kellie was. When Kellie was around 11 or so, we always got a lot of laughs having her stand next to mom because she was taller that her grandma, and, given my mother's height, this was no great feat, but we enjoyed it nonetheless! Among all her other qualities, Kellie inherited my mom's loving nature toward her own husband and children. Mom loved Chris to no end, and always said, "Chris and Kellie are so lucky to have each other." She always talked about what good parents they are. Kellie also inherited mom's attention to detail and perfection. Whenever Kellie needed to do a project for school, it wasn't a simple a poster board with magazine cut-outs glued on it. It was always a full-blown, fully integrated artistic execution! Kellie spent a lot of time with mom when she was young, as mom babysat her after school everyday. Mom always encouraged her artistic abilities, and maintained a thick scrapbook of her artwork that she used to love to brag about!

Adam

Mom always noted how kindhearted her grandson Adam was, and how he'd grown to become such a loving man. She always called him "grandma's boy," and was very proud that he'd made the decision to join the military. Though mom took every opportunity she could to bash wealthy politicians and unfair laws, she was a true patriot. Adam grew up with a gift of common sense and strong moral convictions that mom nurtured every chance she'd get. She was so proud of Adam, and continually worried about him when he'd go to sea on patrols. She always told Adam, "whatever you choose to do in life, give it your all. If you choose to be a garbage man, be the BEST garbage man in the world."

Amaya

Next to arrive was her great-granddaughter, Amaya. Mom always noted what a sweetheart she was, and always commented on how smart she was, and how she looked just like her own mother, Lena. Mom was always the first to meet Amaya at the door to give her a big hug and a kiss, and always said Amaya brought back so many good memories of when Kellie was little.

Joshua

Following Amaya was Joshua. The first time mom held Joshua, she commented on how he looked just like me when I was a baby. She always commented on how cute Josh was, and was so proud of every one of his major accomplishments including, crawling, walking, talking, being potty-trained, and, above all, his love for anything electronic! She always said, "Josh is going to grow up to be an electrical engineer someday!"

HER LEGACY OF RESPONSIBILITY

Mom played many roles throughout her life; she was a devoted wife, the absolute best mother and grandmother, a cherished sister, a favorite "auntie," and a dear friend. She was always one to live by her word, and was always on time for appointments. Nothing frustrated her more than showing up for a doctor's appointment on time, and then having to wait to be seen! One time, after waiting for a half hour in her doctor's waiting room, she got up and told the receptionist, "Does the doctor think he's the only one in the world with something important to do? I've waited long enough. Tell him to call me when he's got time to see me." ... and she walked out! She taught us the value of being prepared, prompt, and willing to accept full responsibility for our actions. Mom was the most patient person in the world until she knew that someone was not being responsible.

HER LEGACY OF GENEROSITY

Mom had an enormous heart filled with passion, compassion and empathy. She had an abundance of unselfish generosity. She never took the easy way out by spending 30 seconds to write a check to a cause; she gave her all to every cause she ever participated in. She was a regular sponsor / coordinator for the March of Dimes, and she always encouraged us, as kids, to donate part of our allowance to such causes. Mom was a dedicated volunteer; a Cub Scouts den mother, a PTA member, a babysitter, a tutor, and a medic to any kid in the neighborhood who needed a Band-Aid and a hug. She earned the nickname "Dr. Martha," and had a patient list of 30-40 neighborhood kids, most of whom were craving nothing more than love and attention that they didn't get at home.

We had a long list of "surrogate" grandparents - people that my mom and dad "adopted" that often spent weekends and holidays with us, as they had nowhere else to go. Ida and Ray Winslow of San Francisco, and Al Haight of Pleasanton were

"grandparents" that I have fond memories of to this day. My parents treated them like family, and gave them the love and generosity that they needed so very much. Mom often cited the saying, "God helps those that help themselves." She was selective in her generosity, always making sure that the cause she was fighting for was valid. She refused to give money to anyone that was homeless and looked like they were able (but unwilling) to work. "Go get a job!" was her comment when it came to many homeless people. She often talked about the homeless people in the Great Depression, and how they all struggled to find work, and would do anything to better themselves. She was disgusted by how lazy society had become in her later years.

HER LEGACY OF COMPASSION

Mom was amazingly kind to everyone. She always said, "Never judge anyone until you've walked in their shoes." She taught us never, under any circumstance, to be mean to anyone or make-fun of anyone. Moreover, we were taught that if someone was being picked on that we should stand up for that person. She really was a champion of the underdog, whether it was a family in need or a political candidate. Perhaps this was because she was so often the underdog in her early years, growing up poor and having to fight for respect and honor. In my childhood years, mom and dad used to regularly volunteer at the US Veteran's Home in Livermore, CA. They'd take gifts to the disabled vets on holidays, which was an education in itself for me as a young boy. Seeing men with no legs, no arms, blind, deaf, and bed-ridden made me realize how tough some people had it, and how they sacrificed their lives for MY freedom. It was at the Vet's home that I first developed a sense of true compassion. The trips back home were always quiet, and there were always tears welling up in my dad's eyes as we drove away. Equally as beautiful was my mom's devotion to her own parents in their golden years. Her and dad actually moved back to Minnesota for a short time to take care of mom's folks. This is, perhaps, the reason that Dan and I felt so strongly about taking care of mom and dad in their time of need.

HER LEGACY OF HARD WORK

My mom had an outstanding work ethic. Whether working in the family business, organizing an event for the PTA, teaching school, running the school library, volunteering as a census taker, or donating her time at the voting polls, she went above and beyond the call. Although she only stood 5' - 5" and never weighed much more than 100 lbs., she stood up for what she believed in and made her opinion count. Her strong sense of conviction made her a endless source of conversation, and she loved to regularly address such controversial subjects such as politics and religion!

Nothing disgusted mom more than laziness or selfish people. She had no tolerance for wealthy politicians, TV evangelists, or uncaring people that were born into wealth! Whenever something was unjust, mom was say, "It's money. It's all about money. That's all they care about." (followed by an all too familiar lecture about what she'd do if SHE won the lottery!) Mom was an attentive listener, and, while talking to her, you'd instantly feel her sincerity by her keen eye contact. She took great care in listening to the "whole story" before offering an opinion or giving advice. My mom taught us never to do anything "half baked." She never simply "bought cookies" - she made cookies, from scratch, and always placed them with care on an attractive plate, with a complimentary garnish, wrapped in pastel cellophane, and often hidden with equal care from my Dan and I!

HER LEGACY OF EDUCATION

An avid reader, mom enjoyed books of all types. In Pleasanton, the small town we grew up in, mom used to complain that she had read every book in the library! It was the countless trips to the library that inspired me to appreciate literature at an early age. She served as school librarian at Alisal Elementary School in Pleasanton, and often brought books home that were in need of repair. She'd enlist everyone in the family in the book repair process... re-binding, repairing damaged book spines, and replacing covers.

Every day, without fail, she'd take a "nap" in the afternoon, which in fact was her time to read. Some of her favorite authors were Taylor Caldwell, Danielle Steele, and Pearl S. Buck. She bought me a copy of "The Good Earth" by Pearl S. Buck when I was in 5th grade. She handed it to me, and said, "you'll love reading this someday." "Someday" came quickly, as my curiosity got the best of me, and I read the book cover-to-cover in a matter of weeks. From that time on, reading was one of my favorite pastimes.

Mom knew how to motivate and inspire anyone, and knew how to do it in such a subtle manner that even the most unpleasant tasks seemed enjoyable. She tutored me in German classes throughout high school, and always said that everyone should speak at least one foreign language. We'd wash dishes every night together after dinner while she'd listen to me recite my German lessons. I have so many fond memories of standing at the sink next to mom. She loved crossword puzzles and anything that challenged her mind. When I was a kid, we used to all play Scrabble together, and I know now

that the motivation behind that game was to teach us how to spell!

HER LEGACY OF COMMUNICATION

Because she was such a great communicator, she had a gift for making friends. But more than this, she kept her friends. People like Betty Hatfield, Joy Roberts, Marilyn Michell, Dorothy Boyce, Doris Yarbrough, Lois Hauso, and Mickey Fessler could always be found at our kitchen table in the afternoon having coffee, tea, and homemade cookies. Having lived all over the United States, she maintained contacts throughout the country, always taking great care to send birthday, anniversary, or holiday greeting cards and letters on a consistent basis; some for over 50 years. She always encouraged me to have pen pals, whether they were relatives or friends in foreign countries. And, she kept in constant touch over the years (until she could no longer write) with her family and friends throughout the country. She was an extraordinary typist, until she learned to communicate with a cassette tape recorder!

HER LEGACY OF FAIRNESS AND DISCIPLINE

She had extraordinary perseverance and an ability to forge ahead regardless of what life dealt her. Raising 2 children in the early seventies, she faced many challenges. Her sense of morality and her overwhelming faith in God, coupled with her outstanding teaching abilities, was an excellent recipe for a perfect mother. She never went around an obstacle; she went right over it while maintaining her dignity and self respect. She rarely got angry, and seldom had the need to even raise her voice. As kids, we had so much respect for her that we knew, beyond a doubt, when we were "treading on thin ice." She was the disciplinarian in the family, and was ALWAYS fair and impartial. She wasn't opposed to issuing a good spanking when it was necessary, whether by "hand" or with a flyswatter (which, to this day, still scares me!)

HER LEGACY OF FAITH AND DEVOTION

Mom's devotion to her dad, Dan, and I was truly extraordinary. We always - absolutely, unequivocally came first. She always put our needs ahead of her own. If we needed a new pair of shoes and she needed a new winter coat, we got the shoes. This could explain why so many of her coats had mismatched buttons!

Growing up in an affluent town like Pleasanton had the potential to create many negative situations. The majority of our neighbors continually struggled for a position in society, but often wound-up at our kitchen table in tears, seeking my mom's good counsel. Over a period of two years, there were 6 divorces on our street alone. Mom accredited this to selfishness, immorality, and greed, and made sure we knew, at an early age, the importance of morality, marriage, and family. She was often angered when listening to politicians talk about "family values!" She'd say, "Hillary Clinton's a fine one to talk. She can't even control her own husband, yet she's telling everyone it takes a village to raise a child. It takes LOVE to raise a child, not a village."

Mom was equally disgusted by organized religion for profit. She said there's a bit of truth in every religion, but the only real truth was in Jesus Christ. She devoted her entire life to the Lord, and had faith that was unshakable. I doubt that I'll ever meet someone with as much faith in God as mom. Jesus was her PERSONAL savior, and she always took great care to practice what she preached.

We were never a big church-going family. Instead, we simply "walked the walk." We learned by living two basic principles... the Golden Rule, and the 10 Commandments - mom's recipes for salvation and eternal life. She read the Bible with zeal, and loved to talk about it. Many of mom's neighbors were regular church-goes who periodically asked mom to go to church with them. She resented this, and would say, "These people need to get up off the church pews and go DO something. They sit there, all smug, trying to sell religion door-to-door like a business. I know who God is, and I don't need to spend my life being "sold" on religion. God 's right here - in my heart - and I know where I'm going when I die. I don't need some cheap mail-order evangelist to tell me what to believe in."

Mom was raised in the Catholic church by a Lutheran mother. She said that in her dad's last days, he'd take her to a different church every Sunday. She said he found no comfort in Catholicism, and said he was "searching for peace." It was likely at that time that mom found that God was in her heart - not in a particular denomination. She often said, "People have become misled, looking for God in all the wrong places. Most of these evangelists are after nothing more than a buck." Every time another evangelist or priest would be convicted of a crime, she'd say, "there ya go... another one God caught up with!"

We were well cared for and more importantly, SO well loved. We were told we could do anything with our lives and there were no bounds to our dreams and goals. Mom always believed in us - unconditionally. Her priorities were quite simple -

God, Family, and Work (in that order). My mom was so very proud of us, her two sons. We were always close to her, especially over the past couple years, a gift she treasured. Because of mom, Dan and I have developed an amazing ability to persevere through incredible adversity. Our devotion to mom and our family is at the heart and soul of our world.

HER LEGACY OF HUMOR

Mom loved to laugh! And, we loved nothing more than to MAKE her laugh! The crowning achievement was to get my mother to laugh so hard she'd cry. I can recall countless times - mom laughing, with tears rolling down her cheeks, usually when we'd imitate her or dad!

HUMOROUS THOUGHTS ABOUT MOM:

Mom was the "Queen of Lists." She'd write everything down, in order, long before planners and PIM's even existed. In her later years, she kept no less than 10 lists (updated daily) attached to the refrigerator door with magnets!

When mom wasn't pleased with something, she'd shake her head to one side, roll her eyes, and grin.

Mom was seldom, if ever, without lipstick or manicured nails. She always took great pride in her appearance. Even when she'd spend the entire day cleaning the house, she always looked attractive. And, ALWAYS smelled like Chanel No. 5!

Mom loved coffee, and would never drink it until it was cold. She'd pour a cup, and let it sit on the kitchen counter for a few hours before drinking it. She always said, "That's the way your grandma Hanson always drank coffee - the Norwegian way."

Mom never believed the expiration date on dairy products really mattered. Likewise, any baked goods had a shelf life of at least three weeks. She absolutely HATED to throw food away.

Mom loved to sing, and could be heard singing throughout the house daily. Her and dad were a great duet. I still have the fondest of memories of mom singing to me at bedtime every night. Such songs as "That Little Boy of Mine," "Mairzy Doats," "Battle Hymn of the Republic," (my favorite), and the "Tennessee Waltz" were standard faire right after saying our prayers. If we wanted to "stall" going to sleep, we'd drag out the prayers to include "God Bless..." (every name we could think of, including our pets, our neighbors pets, the names of presidents, cartoon characters, etc.). Mom never had the heart to stop the blessings either!

Flashlights were important. You never knew when the lights would go out and you'd need one - or seven.

Mom was a practicing amateur meteorologist. She'd write down the high and low temperatures every day on the calendar in her pantry, and often refer to it during discussions about how hot or cold it was on a particular day.

Mom was a chocolate lover extraordinaire! ANYTHING chocolate was her favorite. But, for some reason, she'd always buy Neopolitan ice cream, and there was always left-over vanilla and strawberry. The last meal mom had on this earth was chocolate pudding and chocolate milk!

HER FAVORITE SAYINGS WERE:

"Tomorrow's another day"

...meaning, "I've heard enough of your complaining... get over it and let's talk about something positive!"

"...and I don't mean maybe."

...meaning, "get in your room NOW, or you WILL get spanked!"

"Oh, so much!"

...meaning, "I can't eat all of that food. Give some to your father - as she'd pass him spoonfuls of potatoes, rice, vegetables, etc. Dad learned early on not to overload his dinner plate, as he always knew he'd be eating half of mom's meal before dinner was over.

"Things could be worse."

No matter how bad something seemed, mom could make it seem trivial. Even an amputated leg could be an opportunity for something positive like keeping the guy at the prosthetic limb factory employed.

"Here, honey, take this home with you for a snack."

This could range anywhere from a half-eaten box of stale Wheat Thins, to a fully prepared roast beef dinner. Mom would NEVER let anyone leave the house without taking food home. On more than one occasion, when mom wasn't looking, Dan or I would throw the food into one another's car, and quickly run. The exception to this rule was when mom sent chocolate chip cookies or brownies home with us. Then we'd try to steal from one another. (In fact, I think there's still a half empty bag of stale pretzels under my car seat from a few months ago that I'll pass on to Dan soon).

"Love you... call me when you get home."

This was the standard "good-bye" when visiting mom's house. Despite the fact that we lived less than 3 miles away, mom always wanted to make sure we arrived home safely. Plus, the phone call was a way to find out of we'd eaten any of the leftovers she sent home with us.

"My God, the traffic!"

This was the standard "hello" when mom would visit our house. Despite the fact that she'd normally visit on a Sunday afternoon and the streets in town were virtually empty, she'd always complain about "the traffic."

"Oh, for cry eye" or "Oh, for cripes sakes"

None of us really knew what these sayings meant, but we suspect they're rooted somewhere deep in Minnesota culture. They'd normally be heard when we'd rip the knees out of our new Levi's, or walk into the house with bleeding elbows and broken teeth after bicycle accidents.

"Oh, Jeez!"

Another Minnesota phenomenon. (*see above)

"My God, Bob, slow down!"

Mom was the Queen of backseat driving. Although she never drove (after moving to California), she knew every rule of the road as quoted directly from the DMV handbook. One of the happiest days of mom's life was when dad got a speeding ticket in Oregon after mom gave him a warning to slow down. She could hardly contain herself as the state trooper approached our car. Dad spent the remainder of our vacation convinced that she was a witch and had put a spell on him.

CONCLUSION

The dignity and grace by which mom sailed through life has left a wake of beauty across the many hearts she touched. She spent her entire life dedicated to Jesus, her Lord and Savior, so we know she is in a wonderful place with Him. Knowing my mom, she's probably already in the midst of planning her "arrival" party and busy compiling the guest list of family members and friends who arrived in heaven before her! May she rest in peace and enjoy every minute of the wonders of eternal life. We love you, miss you, and look forward to seeing you again, mom.

"Veterans recall spending Christmas overseas in wartime"

By STEVE CAHALAN / Tribune business editor

Hubert Drugan, 83, of Trempealeau County, Wisconsin., was in the Army from March 1941 to July 1945, and spent three Christmases overseas - in North Africa, England and in the Battle of the Bulge in Belgium.

Most of the time, Drugan drove a reconnaissance jeep. "We'd mostly be ahead of the column," he said. "A lot of the times we'd be out checking for blown bridges, sometimes even behind enemy lines."

On Christmas Day 1942, in French Morocco, "We'd already kicked the Germans out of our area," Drugan recalled. Members of his unit spent the holiday resting and relaxing, and had a special holiday dinner with turkey, mashed potatoes and gravy.

On Christmas Day 1943, Drugan and his unit were at a base in England, training for the D-Day invasion of France. He remembers having another holiday dinner with turkey, and attending a church service on the base.

His most memorable - and miserable - Christmas was in 1944, during the Battle of the Bulge. On Dec. 21, Drugan's unit had


made a 100-mile march "in half rain, half snow" across Germany to join the battle.

On Christmas Day that year, Drugan said, "We were up at the front. There was snow on the ground and it was cold." His unit was engaged in battle until early afternoon, when German soldiers retreated. "We didn't get our dinner until 3:30 or 4 PM", Drugan said. "They brought up our dinner - turkey, mashed potatoes, dressing and gravy. It was hot, but it cooled off fast."

While he ate his Christmas dinner, Drugan watched German soldiers retreating on a nearby ridge.






